

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY, MAY 25, 1998 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minor initial attack fire activity was reported yesterday. The National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC) continued to mobilize resources to Mexico. The NICC has been tasked by the Office of Foreign Disaster Assistance to fill supply orders for Guatemala. Crew demobilization from Canada is continuing. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and Michigan.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

CARLA LAKE, Fort Greely Army Base. This lightning caused fire is burning in grass and hardwoods 15 miles southwest of Delta Junction. Crews successfully burned out the east side of the fire. They will work on burning out the west side today.

OUTLOOK:

New Mexico and west Texas will be partly cloudy in the northeast with a slight chance of afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Dry conditions will prevail elsewhere. High temperatures will be in the 80's to mid 90's with upper 60's to lower 80's in the New Mexico mountains.

The Great Lakes States will be partly to mostly cloudy with a chance of showers in western and southern Wisconsin. High temperatures will be in the 60's to lower 70's.

Colorado will be mostly sunny in the morning. The east will become mostly cloudy in the afternoon with a chance of thunderstorms. Isolated thunderstorms are forecast in the west and over the mountains. High temperatures will be in the 70's with 50's and 60's in the mountains.

Alaska will be mostly cloudy in the south with a chance of rain. The north will be partly to mostly sunny. High temperatures will be in the upper 40's to upper 50's.
