

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, MAY 31, 1998 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minor initial attack fire activity was reported nationally. Large fire activity continues in Canada. Currently Alberta has five large fires burning, which have consumed over 454,664 acres. Five Type I crews from the Northern Rockies were mobilized to Edmonton, Alberta yesterday. The National Interagency Coordination Center (NICC) is processing overhead and equipment requests for Alaska. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Texas, New Mexico, Arizona, Utah, Minnesota, Michigan, New York and New Hampshire.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

CARLA LAKE, Fort Greely Army Base. This fire is 15 miles southwest of Delta Junction, AK. A Type I Incident Management Team (Stam) is assigned. Four structure protection sites have been identified. Yesterday afternoon high winds created extreme fire behavior and halted flight operations.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

HOLIDAY, Apalachicola NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Kearney) is assigned. This fire is 18 miles southwest of Tallahassee. Burn-out activity continues, though progress is slow. Temperatures dropped 5-10 degrees across the area and relative humidities have risen slightly. Intense fire behavior is still being observed. Current threats are to wilderness values and pockets of commercial timber.

OUTLOOK:

Alaska will be mostly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be 55 to 70. Winds will be southwest 10 to 20 MPH.

Arizona, New Mexico and Texas will be mostly sunny and warm. High temperatures at the lower elevations will be in the 90's except 100's in the deserts of Arizona. Highs will be in the 70's in the mountains.

The Great Lakes States will be mostly cloudy and cooler, with scattered showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be 55 to 70. Winds will be breezy from the west at 15-25 MPH.

Florida will be mostly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms. Winds will be from the west at 5-10 MPH. High temperatures will be 90 to 95.
