

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
THURSDAY, OCTOBER 1, 1998 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minimal initial attack activity was reported. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for one Type I Incident Management Team and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Nebraska, Oregon, Texas and Montana.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS:

HURRICANE GEORGES: Birch's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center at Roosevelt Roads Naval Base in Puerto Rico. The Team continues to support FEMA efforts on the Island. The Team has processed 828,000 pounds of ice, 820,000 gallons of water, 3,000 cots, 11,000 blankets and 28,000 rolls of plastic and building supplies.

Melton's Type I Incident Management Team has been released from the Caribbean NF and will be traveling home today.

Bateman's Type I Incident Management Team has been released and will be traveling home today.

Wand's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center in Montgomery, AL. The team is receiving a steady flow of relief supplies for hurricane victims. Supplies at the center include cots, Meals Ready to Eat (MRE's), blankets, water, ice, generators, toilets and chainsaws. The Center is shipping supplies out to FEMA Disaster Field Offices. The Center has received 71 truck loads since 9/27.

Bennett's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center at Camp Beauregard in Pineville, LA. The Team had limited activity, receiving only five loads of cots, wash kits and tarps yesterday. Partial demobilization and a decision on the further use of the center will occur over the next 24 hours. The center has processed 40 truck loads, including ice, water, cots, generators, wash kits, tarps, batteries and building materials.

OUTLOOK:

An upper level low pressure system will move across Utah producing scattered showers and thunderstorms across eastern Nevada, southeastern Idaho, Utah and Wyoming. Scattered showers and thunderstorms will also develop across Colorado and New Mexico. Southwestern Montana and the far northern sections of Arizona will have isolated showers and thunderstorms. A cold front will move into western Washington and northeastern Oregon during this afternoon bringing rain along the coast and increasing clouds to eastern Washington and eastern Oregon. Most of Montana and Idaho will have dry and mild conditions. California will be dry and a little warmer. High temperatures in the West will range from the in the 60's in the mountains, 70's to mid 80's in the valleys, and mid 80's to mid 90's in the southern deserts.

West Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will have increasing clouds with a chance of showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be 80's to mid 90's.
