

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SATURDAY, OCTOBER 17, 1998 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity increased in Southern California and continued in the Southwest Area. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for 1 airtanker, 5 type II helicopters, 2 caterers, 2 showers, radios, equipment, and miscellaneous overhead. High to very high fire indices were reported in California, Montana, Colorado, Kansas, Nevada.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

OGILVY, LOS PADRES NF. A Type II Incident management Team (McClain) is assigned. This fire is 3 miles north of Gibraltar Reservoir and is burning in habitat of known populations of threatened and endangered Red Legged Frogs and Arroyo Toads. The fire is approaching the Dick Smith Wilderness.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

BS, Gila NF. This fire is 18 miles south of Reserve, NM. A Type I Incident Management Team (Bateman) is assigned. Cooler temperatures with high winds did not result in rapid fire spread yesterday.

RAEL, Gila NF. This fire is 12 miles from Aragon, NM. The fire was active on all perimeters.

OUTLOOK:

A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED FOR THE SANTA BARBARA AREA OF CALIFORNIA FOR STRONG NORTH TO NORTHEAST WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY. A surface high pressure will build into the Great Basin and produce local north to northeast winds of up to 40 MPH over Southern California. Northern and central California will be warm and dry.

The Great Basin will be cool and not as windy. An upper level low pressure system over the central Rockies will produce areas of snow in Wyoming and Colorado. New Mexico and Arizona will be cooler and not as windy with isolated snow showers in northern New Mexico. A weak Pacific front will bring rain to Washington and northern Oregon. Montana will remain cool with a few rain and snow showers. High temperatures will range from the 50's in the northern states to the 70's in the southern states. Highs in the Rockies will only be in the 30's and 40's

West Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will be partly cloudy, cooler with breezy west winds from 15-25 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 60's to mid 70's.
