

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, OCTOBER 23, 1998 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity has stabilized in southern California. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for an infrared aircraft and a few miscellaneous overhead. High to very high fire indices were reported in California.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

OGILVY, Los Padres NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (McClain) is assigned. This fire is 13 miles northeast of Santa Barbara in the Dick Smith Wilderness. Indirect control lines have been established. Favorable weather conditions and fire behavior provided for direct attack on uncontained portions of the fire.

PIRU, Ventura County, California. A Type II Incident Management Team (Festerling) is assigned. This fire is burning in heavy brush west of Castaic near Lake Piru. Fire in heavy brush along the west portion of Division W experienced spotting, causing control problems.

ROUGH, Sierra N.F. A Type II Incident Management Team (Sherwood) is assigned. This fire is 18 miles east of Pine Flat Dam, east of Fresno. Major demobilization occurred yesterday.

OUTLOOK:

The upper level low over Idaho will bring cooler and more stable air to Arizona and New Mexico. A cold front will move onto the Washington, Oregon and northern California coast Saturday morning, sweeping across the West Saturday and Sunday. This system appears to be strong enough to bring some precipitation to many areas including central and southern California. Gusty southwest winds are expected ahead of the front with northwest to northeast winds behind it. Strong high pressure will build in behind the front bringing dry, warm offshore winds Sunday and Monday to central and southern California. High temperatures will range from the 60's and 70's, with 50's in the mountains and coastal areas and 80's to mid 90's in the southern deserts.
