

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 1998 - 0530 MDT  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity remained minimal. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a crew, caterer, shower and equipment for a new large fire in the Northwest Area. Miscellaneous overhead requests continued to be processed to help support relief efforts for damage caused by Hurricane Georges. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Nebraska, Oregon, Colorado and Kansas.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS:

HURRICANE GEORGES: Melton's Type I Incident Management Team and two crews are assigned to the Caribbean NF in Puerto Rico. To date they have cleared 86% (27.4 miles) of the roads in the forest. A team of engineering, wildlife and watershed experts are evaluating the damage left by Hurricane Georges.

Birch's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center at Roosevelt Roads Naval Base in Puerto Rico. The Team has now processed 310,000 pounds of ice. St. Croix is closed to the public due to flooded roads.

Bateman's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center in Jacksonville, FL. The Team is presently awaiting storm damage assessment for possible redeployment.

Wand's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center in Montgomery, AL. The Team has been receiving a steady flow of relief supplies for hurricane victims. Supplies at the center have included cots, Meals Ready to Eat (MRE's), blankets, water, ice and generators.

Bennett's Type I Incident Management Team is operating a Receiving and Distribution Center at Camp Beauregard in Pineville, LA.

OUTLOOK:

An upper level low over southern California will bring scattered showers and thunderstorms to California and Nevada. An influx of monsoon moisture will spread scattered showers and thunderstorms from Arizona and New Mexico, northward into Utah, Colorado, southern Wyoming and the extreme southern portion of Idaho. Meanwhile, a weak Canadian cold front will spread some clouds, gusty winds and cooler temperatures across eastern Montana. The Pacific Northwest, Idaho and western Montana will be dry and mild. High temperatures will be in the 50's and 60's in the mountains, 70's to lower 80's in the valleys, and 80's to lower 90's in the southern deserts.

West Texas and the Oklahoma panhandle will be partly sunny and hot. High temperatures will be in the 90's.
