

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
TUESDAY, AUGUST 10, 1999 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity continued in the Western Great Basin Area. Initial attack and large fire activity was reported in the Northern Rockies, Eastern Great Basin and Northern California Areas. Minor initial attack was reported in the Northwest, Rocky Mountains, Southern Area and Southern California. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in the Northwest, Southern California, Northern Rockies, Eastern Great Basin and Western Great Basin Areas. Very high fire indices were reported in the Rocky Mountains and the Eastern Area. New Jersey reported extreme fire danger.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

An Area Command Team (Meuchel) is assigned to support large fires within the Western Great Basin.

SADLER COMPLEX, Elko Field Office, BLM. A Type I Incident Management Team (Storey) is assigned. This fire is 45 miles south of Elko, NV. Three firefighters were injured while performing a burnout operation in fine fuels. They were treated at a local medical facility for minor burns and smoke inhalation. There continues to be hot spots along the perimeter. Gusty winds pushed the flame front at a rate of 40 to 60 chains per hour. Acreage increase reflects more accurate mapping.

DUN GLENN COMPLEX, Winnemucca Field Office, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Vorce) is assigned. The complex consists of 20 fires. Transition to the Type III Team began last evening. Plans are for a full transition by 8/11.

BATTLE MOUNTAIN COMPLEX, Battle Mountain Field Office, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Burdick) is assigned. This complex consists of 13 fires. Several fires within the complex reached containment yesterday.

NEW PASS COMPLEX, Carson City Field Office, BLM. A Type II Team (Williams) is assigned. This fire is 60 miles east of Fallon, NV. The New Pass Fire continued to burn actively. Hotter and drier temperatures are a continued concern, as are predicted wind speeds of 10-20 miles per hour. Low relative humidities, shifting winds, steep and rocky terrain are hampering control efforts.

EUREKA COMPLEX, Battle Mountain Field Office, BLM. This complex includes the Trail Canyon fire. Extreme behavior was observed within the fire perimeter yesterday. Good progress is being made on active flanks. Current threats continue to be to private property and grouse habitat.

EAST CANYON, Elko District, BLM. This fire is located 35 miles southeast of Jackpot, NV. The fire is a holdover from last week's lightning. Yesterday, the fire was very active in juniper fuels and grew from 100 acres to 400 acres quite rapidly.

NORTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

LAKE WENATCHEE COMPLEX, Wenatchee National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Furlong) is assigned. This fire is fifteen miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. The complex contains 18 fires of which 2 are controlled. Some resources were released yesterday in preparation for transition to a local Type III Team, planned for 0600 on 8/11.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

DEER CREEK, Lower Snake District, BLM. This fire is 16 miles southeast of Jordan Valley, OR. Mop-up continued on the fireline yesterday. The fire is not expected to threaten containment lines; however, occasional torching could create spot fires.

SOLDIER, Salmon/Challis National Forest. A Fire Use Team (Sexton) is assigned. Fire activity has been minimal due to higher relative humidities and lower temperatures.

RAMEY, Payette National Forest. This Wildland Fire Use incident will be monitored by the Sheepeater Lookout and aerial reconnaissance. The fire was not very active yesterday.

I-86, MILEPOST 4, Upper Snake River, South-Central Idaho, BLM. No additional information was reported.

NORTHERN ROCKIES AREA LARGE FIRES

PINE RIDGE, Southern Land Office, Montana State. The fire is located 38 miles east/northeast of Billings, MT. The fire is being managed by Yellowstone County and the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation. Several Federal agencies are assisting with suppression operations.

ALLEN CREEK, Southern Land Office, Montana State. The fire is located near Park City, MT. The fire is being managed by Stillwater County, with assistance from the Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation.

EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

BLACK BEAR MOUNTAIN, New York State. This 750 acre fire is on the northern edge of West Point Military Reservation, two miles south of Cornwall-on- Hudson, New York. The fire area has been used since the 1830s as an artillery impact area for the U.S. Military Academy. Firefighters and aviation resources have been pulled off direct suppression efforts, due to multiple ordnance detonations. A military demolition team will sweep the area before line construction resumes. U. S. Forest Service personnel provided assistance to the military with fire assessment and planning.

OUTLOOK:

Idaho, Nevada and Utah will have scattered thunderstorms, some possibly dry. Daytime relative humidities will be in the 10 to 20 percent range with strong winds. The strongest winds are forecast for Utah, where they should range from 20 to 30 miles per hour with gusts to 50 miles per hour; stronger near thunderstorms.

Northern California, Oregon and Washington should expect morning low clouds and fog along the coast, clearing by the afternoon. Maximum temperatures will be in the 70's with minimum relative humidities in the 40 percent range. Isolated thunderstorms are forecast along the northern California Coastal Range. Scattered thunderstorms are forecast for inland California, north through Oregon and Washington. Maximum afternoon temperatures will be in the lower 90's with minimum relative humidities of 25 percent and light winds away from thunderstorms.
