

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 THURSDAY, AUGUST 12, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Good progress was made on large fires in the Northwest and the Northern Rockies Areas. Moderate initial attack activity was reported in the Northern California and Northwest Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, Washington, California, Montana, North Dakota, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, Arizona, Connecticut, Delaware, Massachusetts, Maine, Maryland, New Jersey, New Hampshire, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Oklahoma, and West Virginia.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

EUREKA COMPLEX, Battle Mountain Field Office, BLM. This complex includes the Trail Canyon fire. Operations to secure the interior of the northeast flank will be completed today. Crews will continue to construct line as needed.

EAST CANYON, Elko Field Office, BLM. This fire is located 35 miles southeast of Jackpot, NV. No acreage gain was reported yesterday, yet hot spots still exist in the piñon pine and juniper fuels.

LAKE WENATCHEE COMPLEX, Wenatchee National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Furlong) is assigned. This fire is fifteen miles northwest of Leavenworth, WA. The complex contains 20 fires of which 16 are controlled. No new information was reported.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

SOLDIER, Salmon/Challis National Forest. A Fire Use Team (Sexton) is assigned. No new information was received.

RAMEY, Payette National Forest. A Fire Use Team (Hescock) is assigned. This Wildland Fire Use incident is being monitored by the Sheepeater Lookout and aerial reconnaissance. No new information was received.

SCOTT CREEK, Sawtooth National Forest. A Fire Use Team (Fay) is assigned. Activity was limited to single tree torching and light ground movement. The fire is being monitored by fixed wing reconnaissance. Fire activity has been minimal due to higher relative humidities and lower temperatures.

RENSHAW, Nez Perce National Forest. This fire is 22 miles east of Lowell, ID. The fire is burning in the Selway Bitterroot Wilderness, and is being managed as a Wildland Fire Use incident. The fire is burning in grass and open timber. Current threat is to the Selway River Trail.

EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

CROW S NEST, New York State. This fire is located on the northern edge of the West Point Military Reservation, two miles south of Cornwall-on-Hudson, New York. The fire is burning in an area that has been used as an artillery impact area for the U.S.Military Academy since

the 1830's. This fire remains at 900 acres and is now 60 percent contained. The area received some precipitation yesterday. Dozer and handlines were completed in preparation for a burnout operation scheduled for today. Suppression activities are being conducted jointly by the Palisades Interstate Park Commission, New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, Department of Defense - West Point, New York National Guard and local volunteer fire departments.

OUTLOOK:

An upper level low pressure area will move from the Great Basin into the upper plains this morning. Residual moisture from the low pressure area, coupled with surface heating will bring the chance of scattered showers and thunderstorms to the Great Basin this afternoon.

Another upper level low pressure area will form off the pacific northwest coast which will generate scattered showers and thunderstorms along the Cascades.

High temperatures will be in the 60's along the coast, mid 60's to the lower 80's in the mountains, mid 80's to upper 90's in the lower valleys of north and central Nevada, and near 105 in southern Nevada.

Minimum relative humidities will range from 50 percent along the coast to around 20 percent in the inland valleys. Winds will be light away from the thunderstorms.
