

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
TUESDAY, JULY 6, 1999 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Good progress was made on large fires in the Great Basin and Rocky Mountain Areas. Moderate fire activity was reported in California, the Western Great Basin and Alaska. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized infrared aircraft, radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. High to extreme fire indices were reported in Nevada, California, Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, Colorado, Alaska, Wyoming, west Texas and Idaho.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

RAILROAD, Richfield Field Office, BLM. A Type I Incident Management Team (Storey) is assigned. This fire is 24 miles northwest of Nephi, UT. No active burning was observed and mop-up continues.

WRIGLEY, Moab Field Office, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Suwyn) is assigned. This fire is 50 miles southwest of Grand Junction, CO and has burned into the Black Ridge Complex on Grand Junction District, BLM. No new information was received.

MEADOW SPRING, Cedar City Field Office, BLM. This fire is 60 miles northwest of Cedar City, UT. Lighter winds aided containment efforts and good progress was made on the fire.

WEST MOUNTAIN II, Uinta National Forest. This fire is five miles from Genola, UT. Fire activity was minimal and burnout operations along the southeast flank were successful.

BIRTHDAY, Craig District, BLM. This fire is near Maybell, CO. Current threats are to a microwave tower and communication site. Crews made good progress on the fire yesterday.

BLACK RIDGE COMPLEX, Grand Junction District, BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Sexton) is assigned. The fires in this complex are 20 to

25 miles west of Grand Junction, CO. The Wrigley fire on Moab Field Office, BLM has burned into this complex. No new information was received.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

LOWDEN, California Department of Forestry, Shasta-Trinity Ranger Unit. A State Type I Incident Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This fire is near the community of Lewiston, CA. Control problems continue to be winds changing directions, unburned fuels within the fire perimeter and steep slopes.

EASTERN AREA INCIDENTS:

INDEPENDENCE DAY 99 SEARCH AND RESCUE, Superior National Forest, USFS. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bonde) is assigned. On July 4, the Superior National Forest experienced a major stand replacing wind event in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. It ranged from 3 to 7 miles wide and 40 miles long. The Type II Incident Management Team was requested to assist various counties in their search and rescue efforts. The Forest Service has been involved in 15 air evacuations of campers.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN CENTRAL UTAH FOR DRY LIGHTNING AND GUSTY THUNDERSTORM WINDS. ***

An upper level high pressure system will be over Colorado and monsoonal moisture will bring wet thunderstorm activity to New Mexico, Arizona, southern Colorado and southern Utah. Widely scattered, dry thunderstorms are forecast from northwestern Arizona, central and northeastern Utah into northwest Colorado. A few thunderstorms may spill over into southern Wyoming and southern Nevada.

A thermal low pressure area will develop over Nevada, Utah and northern Arizona bringing near red flag conditions for gusty southwest winds to western Nevada. A strengthening westerly pressure gradient over the Sierra Nevada and southern Cascades will generate windy conditions over the eastern slopes. Near red flag conditions will occur in northeastern California for gusty southwest winds. Wind speeds will be 15 to 25 MPH gusting to 35 MPH over western Nevada and northern California east of the Sierra crest.

The rest of the West will have mostly sunny skies. Temperatures will range from the 60's and 70's in the Northwest Pacific coast to the 80's and 90's over inland areas and 105 to 112 in the hottest southwestern deserts.
