

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
THURSDAY, JULY 22, 1999 - 0530 MDT  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity occurred in California and the Northwest. Minimal activity was reported elsewhere. New large fires occurred in Northern California, the Great Basin, and the Northern Rockies. Good progress was made on large fires in the Great Basin and the Northwest. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized airtankers, infrared aircraft, radio equipment, helicopters, miscellaneous overhead, type 1 crews and a shower unit. The National Interagency Fire Center jet will be moving 4 type 1 crews from Alaska to the Great Basin and southern California today. High to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, Wyoming, California, Idaho, Utah, and Nevada.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

SPANISH, Santa Barbara County Fire Department, California. A Type II Incident Management Team (Smith) is assigned. This fire is 20 miles west of Cuyama, California on Spanish Ranch. The fire is continuing to experience extreme behavior with unpredictable winds. Structures on state lands are threatened and protection resources remain in place. Long range contingency plans have been implemented to keep the fire out of the San Raphael Wilderness area.

GOAT, Los Angeles County Fire Department, California. This fire is on Catalina Island, northwest of the Airport in the Sky. The Island has requested assistance from Los Angeles County Fire Department and California Department of Forestry. The United States Navy is transporting personnel and equipment to the Island from Long Beach, California through a mutual aid agreement.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

CEDAR BUTTE, Upper Snake River District, Idaho, BLM. The fire is 25 miles northwest of Blackfoot, Idaho. On East Butte, a major communications site is threatened. Numerous structures are threatened including residences, ranches and outbuildings. The citizens of Atomic City and surrounding areas are without power because a threatened powerline was switched off. The fire has spread onto Idaho National Engineering and Environmental Laboratory lands.

EIGHT MILE, Salmon/Challis National Forest, Idaho. A Type II Incident Management Team(Casey)is assigned. The fire is 20 miles west of Challis, ID. The fire is in a roadless area creating access problems. Smoke is a concern.

SAMARIA, Northwest Utah State. The fire is near Portage, Utah. Unpredictable winds and flashy fuels lead to rapid rate of spread causing control problems. Structures are threatened and one vehicle was lost.

SOLIDER, Salmon/Challis National Forest, Idaho. A Fire Use Management Team (Wallace)is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. It is burning 30 miles northwest of Stanley, Idaho.
