

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, JULY 30, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minimal initial attack activity was reported nationwide with two new large fires occurring in the Northern Rockies Area. Good progress was made on several large fires, with containment being accomplished on a large fire in California. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized a caterer, shower units, telecommunications equipment, weather equipment, helicopters, infrared aircraft and miscellaneous overhead. High to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, Washington, California, Montana, North Dakota, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, South Dakota, Wyoming, Connecticut, Maine, New York, Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

NORTHERN ROCKIES LARGE FIRES:

SWANEY, Flathead National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Swope) is assigned. This fire is 10 miles west of Whitefish, Montana in the vicinity of Tally Lake. The fire is burning on federal land, but directly adjacent to private property, with structures threatened. Resource needs will be evaluated this morning.

SPRING CREEK, Lewis and Clark National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Williams) is assigned. This fire is located six miles northeast of White Sulphur Springs, Montana. Hot, dry winds continue to hamper suppression efforts.

DEVIL STORM, Bitterroot National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Gauger) is assigned. This fire is 35 miles southwest of Darby, Montana in the Frank Church River of No Return Wilderness. No other information was reported.

BAR Z RIDGE, Northeastern Land Office, Montana State A Type II Incident Management Team (Specht) is assigned. This fire is 30 miles southwest of Kalispell, Montana. The fire is active and burning on all flanks. No additional information was available.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

SOLDIER, Salmon/Challis National Forest. A Fire Use Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. Two lightning ignited fires, thirty miles

northwest of Stanley, Idaho are being managed to accomplish resource objectives. Fire activity was minimal due to overcast skies and higher relative humidities. Crews completed fireline construction along Greyhound Ridge in preparation for a burnout operation. Construction of new fireline and improvements to existing fireline will continue today. The fire has reached the Middle Fork of the Salmon River and is moving in a westerly direction.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN LARGE FIRES:

BULL ELK PARK, Big Horn National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hartman) is assigned. This fire is 17 miles west of Dayton, Wyoming in Sheridan County. Supression tactics have changed from direct attack to indirect attack due to safety concerns for personnel. The terrain is very steep and conditions remain hazardous.

OUTLOOK:

A large ridge of intense high pressure aloft centered over the midwest will continue to dominate much of the western U.S. as well. The moist monsoonal flow underneath this ridge continues to affect areas from the desert southwest, northward into Utah, eastern Idaho and Wyoming. Hot temperatures will again rule most of the deserts and high plateaus, while slightly cooler temperatures can be expected in the mountains. A trough of low pressure over the eastern Pacific will push low clouds and patchy fog onto coastal locations of California, Oregon and Washington.

Monsoon moisture continues to bring isolated to scattered afternoon and evening showers and thunderstorms to Colorado, Utah, New Mexico, Arizona, southern Montana, Wyoming and eastern Idaho. This activity will be especially prevalent over the mountainous sections of these states. Locally heavy rain may accompany the thunderstorms over Utah and Arizona.

The rest of the western U.S. will be hot and dry with mostly sunny skies. Isolated dry thunderstorms can be expected over Nevada, Wyoming and western Idaho. High temperatures will range from the 80's to around 100 degrees in most locations, with 60's and 70's along the coastal locations. There will be 70's and 80's in the mountains and mid 90's to 110 degrees in the southern deserts.
