

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, JUNE 6, 1999 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity increased in the Southwest Area; minimal initial attack activity was reported elsewhere. The Southern and Eastern Areas made significant progress on large fires. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed requests for airtankers, helicopters, a lead plane, miscellaneous overhead, radio equipment, showers, and caterers to the Southwest Area fires. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Georgia, Texas, New Mexico and Arizona.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

LA JARA, Cibola NF. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bustamonte) is assigned. The fire is burning in dense timber 10 miles north of Grants, NM. Good progress was made on lining the perimeter. Air operations were effective on holding the fire out of San Mateo Canyon. A burnout last night will substantially increase acreage.

WATER CANYON, New Mexico State. A Type II Incident Management Team (Anderson) is assigned. This fire is 12 miles east of Grants, NM. Line construction and burnout operations were conducted in the northern division. One cabin on private land was destroyed.

KIOWA, Carson NF. This lightning caused fire is burning in Ponderosa Pine, six miles southwest of Tres Piedras, NM. No new information was received.

WHITETAIL, Mescalero Agency, BIA. A Type II Incident Management Team (Wheeler) is assigned. This fire is located in Otero County. This wind-driven fire is burning in grass and slash.

FRIENDLY, Osceola National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. Fire activity decreased yesterday due to rain associated with the thunderstorms. Mop-up continues south of Florida Highway 2. The majority of resources are working along the Swamp's Edge Break around the Okefenokee Refuge.

LITTLE TROUT, Superior National Forest. This fire is burning in heavy timber in the eastern part of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. No new information was received.

OUTLOOK:

New Mexico will be partly cloudy. Winds will be west at 10 to 20 MPH and gusty. High temperatures will be in the mid 60s to mid 70s in the mountains and northwest, and in the 80s to 90s in the eastern and southern lowlands.

Arizona will be sunny. Winds will be northwest at 10 to 20 MPH with gusts to 30 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 60s to 80s in the mountains and 90s to 100 in the lower elevations.

Northern Florida will be mostly cloudy. Winds will be out of the east at 10 to 20 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 80s to 90s.

Minnesota will be mostly cloudy with thunderstorms likely. Winds will be south 15 to 25 MPH. High temperatures will be 75 to 85.

Colorado will be partly cloudy with widely scattered afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Winds will be west at 10 to 20 MPH, with gusts to 35 MPH. High temperatures will range from 50s to 60s in the mountains and from 70 to 80 in the lower elevations.
