

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SATURDAY, JUNE 12, 1999 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Large fire activity occurred in the Southwest Area and Alaska. Initial attack activity was minimal elsewhere. Mobilization of resources through the National Interagency Coordination Center included the smokejumpers, overhead, a caterer, shower and radio equipment. Demobilization of resources from the Southern Area continues. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, New Mexico, Arizona, west Texas and Georgia.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

RAINBOW, Fort Apache Agency. A Type I Incident Management Team (Humphrey) is assigned. This fire is located near White River, AZ. Approximately twenty homes and some outbuildings have been lost. The Indian Health Service and three subdivisions are threatened. Extremely dry fuels and low relative humidity are contributing to extreme fire behavior.

MT.EMMA, Grand Canyon NP. A Fire Use Management Team (Zimmerman) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is burning 5 miles southwest of Tuweep Ranger Station on the North Rim of the Grand Canyon. The fire was most active on the western and northern flanks, where it continued to move through a string of ponderosa pine.

OUTLOOK:

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms in the eastern half of the state. High temperatures will be in the 70's to mid 80's in the mountains, and 80's to 90's in the south.

Arizona will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be in the upper 60's to 70's in the higher mountains, to 105 in the lowest deserts.

The upper Yukon zone and east of Delta in the Northern Region of Alaska will be mostly sunny, with widely scattered mostly wet thundershowers developing. Winds will be variable, mostly west and southwest at 4 to 8 MPH. Minimum humidities will range from 15 to 25%. High temperatures will be 78 to 88 degrees.

Northern Florida will be mostly cloudy with scattered thunderstorms. Georgia will be partly cloudy with a chance of thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's.

New Jersey will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of afternoon showers or thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the upper 70's to mid 80's.

Southern California will be sunny. High temperatures will be in the 70's to lower 80's.
