

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
TUESDAY, JUNE 15, 1999 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fire activity was reported in the Northwest and Southern areas. Large fire activity continued in Alaska, Western Great Basin and the Southwest Areas. Alaska continues to have new lighting fires and is busy with initial attack. Mobilization of resources through the National Interagency Coordination Center included air tankers and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Georgia, Colorado, California, New Mexico, Arizona, West Texas, Utah and Nevada.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

DONNELLY, Fort Greely Army Base. A Type I Incident Management Team (Stam) is assigned. This fire is twenty-five miles south of Delta, AK. The fire made a major run to the north late Sunday, forcing the evacuation of Fort Greely and part of Delta Junction and temporarily closing the Richardson Highway.

MINTO, Upper Yukon Zone BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Cowins) is assigned. This fire is near Minto, AK. This fire was reported as a burning dump which escaped into the wildland.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

DOLLY, Gila National Forest. This fire is located near the Negrito fire base. The fire was wind driven in ponderosa pine and grass.

MT.EMMA, Grand Canyon NP. A Fire Use Management Team (Zimmerman) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is 5 miles southwest of Tuweep Ranger Station on the Grand Canyon's North Rim. No new information was received.
