

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
TUESDAY, JUNE 22, 1999 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity was reported in the Eastern Great Basin, Southwest and Rocky Mountain Areas. Large fire activity continued in Alaska and the Southwest. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized a helicopter, radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Louisiana, Arizona, New Mexico, West Texas, Southern California, Nevada and Utah.

ALASKA LARGE FIRES:

MINTO, Tanana Zone BLM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Cowin) is assigned. This fire is near Minto, AK. Minimal fire activity was reported on the fire. Crews have been relocated to a spike camp on the southern edge of the fire. Forecasted rain will assist crews on containment efforts.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRE:

BOX CANYON, Saguaro National Monument. A Fire Use Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. This fire is east of Tucson, AZ. Crews supported by aircraft continue to work the perimeter.

MEXICO 15, Coronado National Forest. This fire is in a very remote location thirty miles northwest of Nogales, AZ. The fire is being monitored by aerial observation. The fire is burning in grass and mesquite of which one hundred acres are in Mexico.

OUTLOOK:

Alaska's interior region will be mostly cloudy with showers. High temperatures will be in the 60's to near 70.

Arizona will be sunny to partly cloudy and locally breezy. Isolated mountain thunderstorms are expected mainly in the east this afternoon. High temperatures will be in the mid 70's to mid 80's in the mountains and high plateaus with 90's to 110 in the lower valleys and southern deserts.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with a chance of afternoon and evening thunderstorms. High temperatures will range from the 70's to 80's in the mountains to the 80's and 90's in the lower elevations.

Utah will be partly cloudy with scattered showers and thunderstorms mainly over the mountains. High temperatures will range from 65 to 75 in the mountains, 85 to 95 in the lower elevations and around 100 in the lower southwest valleys.
