

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 THURSDAY, JUNE 24, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity and large fire activity continued in California, the Southwest and the Eastern Great Basin Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized radio equipment, two air tankers, one lead plane, one type I helicopter, a caterer, and miscellaneous overhead to large fires in California and the Southwest. The NIFC jet will demobilize two Type I crews and 40 smokejumpers from Alaska today. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, and Idaho.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

EL TIGRE, Coronado National Forest. This fire is burning in brush and timber in the Chiricahua Mountains in southeast Arizona. High fuel loading is contributing to control problems.

BOX CANYON, Saguaro National Monument. A Fire Use Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. This fire is 10 miles east of Tucson, AZ. The fire is being contained on the south and west along the maximum manageable area boundary.

REAMER, Prescott National Forest. This fire is burning in grasslands 20 miles southeast of Prescott, AZ. The fire spread was to the northeast yesterday. The fire has been placed in a confine status. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

TURKEY, Coconino National Forest. This is a confine fire 45 miles southeast of Flagstaff, AZ. Rock bluffs are holding the fire as it spreads to the east. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRE:

KING, Los Padres National Forest. A Type II Management Team (Smith) is assigned. This fire is approximately 8 miles south of Frazier Park. Crews made good progress yesterday despite high temperatures and low humidities.

Numerous spot fires remain outside the main fireline.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRE:

PONY ROAD, Salt Lake Field Office, BLM. This fire is burning in grass and brush 60 miles southwest of Salt Lake City. This fire started on the Dugway Proving Grounds and burned onto the BLM lands. Winds are causing control problems on the south flank. No suppression action is being taken on the military lands due to unexploded munitions.

OUTLOOK:

*** A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED ALONG THE CALIFORNIA/NORTHERN NEVADA BORDER FOR STRONG WINDS AND LOW FUEL MOISTURE *** Northern California will

be sunny except for morning fog and low clouds along the coast and in the coastal valleys. Mid and high clouds will increase in the afternoon. Winds will be southwest at 20 to 30 MPH on the east slope of the Sierra. High temperatures will be in the 60's along the coastal areas, 60's to lower 70's on the east slope of the Sierra and from the high 80's to the upper 90's in the valleys.

Southern California will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be in the 70's to around 80 in the mountains with 90's to around 100 in the valleys, except in the southern deserts where highs will reach 107 to 115.

*** A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED FOR WEST-CENTRAL AND NORTHERN NEVADA FOR STRONG WINDS AND LOW FUEL MOISTURE *** Nevada will be mostly sunny. Winds will be southwest at 20 to 30 MPH in the north and west central. High temperatures will be in the high 60's to lower 70's in the mountains, 80's to mid 90's in the valleys, with the southern valley temperatures reaching 102 to 112.

Southern Utah will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be from 78 to 84 in the mountains and 95 to 103 in the valleys.

Arizona will be mostly sunny in the north and west, and partly cloudy in the southeast, with a slight chance of afternoon thunderstorms over the higher terrain. High temperatures in the mountains and higher plateaus will be 77 to 89, with 90 to 109 in the valleys, except near the Colorado River, where temperatures will range from 110 to 115.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of afternoon and evening thunderstorms in the east and south-central mountains. High temperatures will range from the mid 70's to around 90 in the mountains, and from the upper 80's to 102 in the lower elevations.
