

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, JUNE 26, 1999 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minimal to moderate initial attack and large fire activity continued in Alaska, California, the Southwest and Great Basin Areas. Minimal initial attack and new large fire activity occurred in the Northwest Area. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized radio equipment, a Type I helicopter, Infrared aircraft, two Type II crews and miscellaneous overhead to northern California and the Great Basin Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, and Colorado.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

WEST MOUNTAIN, Uinta National Forest. This lightning caused fire is located five miles south of Provo, UT. A Type II Incident Management Team (Martin) has been assigned. No other information is available.

CLEAR CREEK, Uinta National Forest. This human caused fire is located five miles south of Provo, UT. A local Type III Incident Management Team has been assigned to this fire.

KINGS CROWN, Upper Snake River District, South-Central Idaho Area, BLM. This fire is two miles northwest of King Hill, ID. The fire is burning in heavy sage, brush and grass.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

BOX CANYON, Saguaro National Monument. A Fire Use Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. This fire is 10 miles east of Tucson, AZ. Work on containing the fire on the northeast perimeter was accomplished and expected control is dependent on the anticipated monsoon weather pattern.

OUTLOOK:

Utah will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of dry thunderstorms in the northern half of the state. Winds will be breezy in the south. High temperatures will be in the upper 70's to 80's in the north, and 90's to 102 in the south.

Nevada will be sunny and breezy in the afternoon. High temperatures will range from the mid 70's to mid 80's, and 90's to 105 in the southern deserts.

Southern Idaho will be mostly sunny and cool. High temperatures will be in the 60's in the mountains, to the mid 70's in the valleys.

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH HAS BEEN POSTED FOR THE NORTHWEST PLATEAU, NORTHWEST DESERTS, KAIBAB PLATEAU, GRAND CANYON COUNTRY, COCONINO PLATEAU AND BLACK MESA DUE TO WINDY CONDITIONS, LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY AND FUEL MOISTURE. Arizona will be mostly clear in the western portion and partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms in the east. Winds will be southwest 15 to 30 MPH with gusts to 40 MPH in the north. High temperatures will be in the upper 70's to 80's in the higher elevations, and 95 to 113 in the lower valleys.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms in the south. High temperatures will range from the 80's to lower 90's in the mountains, and from the 90's to 102 in the lower elevations.

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR THE UPPER SACRAMENTO VALLEY AND SURROUNDING FOOTHILLS FOR GUSTY WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY. Northern California will be sunny. Sacramento valley winds will be 10 to 22 MPH with higher gusts. High temperatures will be in the 60's along the coastal areas and up to the mid 80's inland.

Southern California will be mostly sunny and breezy in the inland deserts. High temperatures will be in the 70's to 90's, except 106 to 114 in the inland deserts.
