

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SUNDAY, JUNE 27, 1999 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack fire activity was reported in the Southwest and California, with minimal activity reported elsewhere. Large fire activity continued in the Southwest and Eastern Great Basin Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona, New Mexico, west Texas and Colorado.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

WEST MOUNTAIN, Uinta National Forest. This lightning caused fire is located five miles south of Provo, UT. Rocky, steep terrain and unburned fuels are hampering line construction efforts. Air support assisted in the protection of radio repeaters.

KINGS CROWN, Upper Snake River District, South-Central Idaho Area, BLM. This fire is burning in heavy sage, brush and grass two miles northwest of King Hill, ID. Full containment was expected last night.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

BOX CANYON, Saguaro National Monument. A Fire Use Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This lightning ignited wildland fire is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. This fire is 10 miles east of Tucson, AZ. Long term fire projections have been completed. The expected control date is dependent on the season ending monsoon weather pattern. Plans are to begin demobilization of crews and overhead today.

OUTLOOK:

Utah will be sunny. High temperatures will be in the 60's to 70's in the mountains and 80's to 105 in the lower elevations.

Nevada will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will range from the mid 70's to mid 80's in the mountains, 85 to 95 in the northern valleys, and 100 to 112 in the southern valleys.

Southern Idaho will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will range from the 60's in the mountains to the upper 70's in the valleys.

Arizona will be sunny and hot. High temperatures will be in the 80's to 90's in the higher elevations and up to 112 in the lower valleys.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with a slight chance of afternoon and evening thunderstorms in the southern mountains. High temperatures will range from the 80's to lower 90's in the mountains, and from the 90's to 105 in the lower elevations.

Northern California will be sunny. High temperatures will be in the 60's along the coastal areas, and up to the upper 80's inland.
