

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, MAY 14, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack and large fire activity was reported for the Southern and Southwest Areas, with minimal fire activity being reported elsewhere. Initial attack fire activity increased in Canada. Crews are making good progress on the large fires in the Province of Ontario. Mobilization through the National Interagency Coordination Center included a caterer, shower unit, radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Demobilization and crew reassignments continued in the Southern Area. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Michigan, New Hampshire, Arizona, New Mexico, and in the Canadian Provinces of Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec and New Brunswick.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

TELEPHONE, Mescalero Agency BIA. This fire is located south of the town of Ruidoso, New Mexico. A Type II Incident Management Team has been ordered. Four airtankers are currently working the fire. Six Type I crews and seven Type II crews will be in place this morning. Unpredictable fire behavior, rough terrain and spotting are hampering suppression efforts. The current threat is to forest resources.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

BROWN FIRE, Everglades National Park. This fire is located near Homestead, Florida. Burn out operations were successful yesterday. Further burn out and widening of the black line will take place tomorrow if conditions are favorable. Acreage increase is due to GPS mapping and burn out operations.

BONITA SPRINGS, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is located near Bonita Beach in Lee County. The fire became active again yesterday afternoon. No further information is available.

OUTLOOK:

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN FLORIDA FOR LOW HUMIDITIES. Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. Winds will be west at 10-15 MPH. Minimum humidities will be 30-45 percent. High temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's.

A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED IN ARIZONA FOR STRONG WINDS, LOW HUMIDITIES AND LOW FUEL MOISTURES. Arizona will be sunny and warm. Minimum humidities will be 10-15 percent in the lower elevations and 10-20 percent in the higher elevations. Winds will be south at 20-30 MPH, with gusts to 40 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 80's to low 100's in the lower elevations and 60-80 degrees in the higher elevations.

A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN CENTRAL AND NORTHERN NEW MEXICO BELOW 9500 FEET FOR GUSTY WINDS AND LOW HUMIDITIES. New Mexico will be partly cloudy with isolated showers in the northern part of the state. Winds will be gusty up to 40 MPH. Minimum humidities will be 5-15 percent. High temperatures will be in the 60's to 70's for the mountains and low 90's around the southern border.

West Texas will be partly sunny. Minimum humidities will be 45 percent. Winds will be from the south at 15-25 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 80's.

Michigan, Northern Minnesota and Wisconsin will be partly cloudy. Minimum humidities will be 20-30 percent. Winds will be from the east at 10-20 MPH. High temperatures will be in the mid 60's to low 70's.
