

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
TUESDAY, MAY 25, 1999 - 0530 MDT  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Increased initial attack activity was reported in the Northwest, California and the Northern Rockies Areas. Large fire activity continued in the Southern and Northern California Areas. Mobilization of resources through the National Interagency Coordination Center included Type 2 helicopters, radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Georgia, Arizona, Texas and New Mexico.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FRIENDLY, Osceola National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Owen) and Unified Command (Ferguson) are assigned. A Type I Incident Management Team was ordered. This fire is located within the Pinhook Swamp. The fire made a major run to the northeast and crossed state Highway 2 into the Okefenokee NWR. A night shift was initiated to start burnout operations from roads to contain the east side of the fire.

NW COMMAND, Florida State Division of Forestry. This fire is located in Palm Beach County. No other information was reported.

BAY CREEK COMPLEX, Apalachicola National Forest. This fire is located in Liberty County. The fire is burning in heavy fuels in an inaccessible area. Strong winds hampered suppression efforts on the fire yesterday.

#### OUTLOOK:

Florida will be mostly sunny in the north and central portions. The south will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's to lower 90's with minimum humidities at 30-40%.

Northern California will be mostly sunny. High temperatures will be in the upper 80's to lower 90's in the inland valleys and 70' to 80's in the mountains.

New Mexico will have variable cloudiness with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 50's and 60's in the mountains, with mid 70's to near 90 in the lower elevations.

West Texas will be mostly cloudy with a chance of thunderstorms. Minimum humidities will be 35-45%. High temperatures will be in the mid 80's.

Alaska will be mostly sunny with scattered afternoon showers and a slight chance of thunderstorms along the Alaska range. Minimum humidities will be 30-40% in the interior. High temperatures will be in the 40's to 50's along the coast with mid 50's to mid 60's in the interior.
