

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, MAY 28, 1999 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate fire activity was reported in the Northern Rockies, Western Great Basin, Rocky Mountain, Eastern, Southern California, Southern and Southwest Areas, with minor activity reported elsewhere. Mobilization of resources through the National Interagency Coordination Center included an infrared aircraft, airtanker, helicopters, equipment and miscellaneous overhead. The NIFC jet is mobilizing crews internally for the Southern Area. Very high and extreme fire indices were reported in Georgia, Mississippi, California, Arizona, New Mexico and Texas.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FRIENDLY, Osceola National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. This team is also managing the Hickory Island fire. Yesterday the north and northwest sides of the fire were active. Contingency plans are being developed as the fire is within one mile from the community of Baxter, GA.

OVERLOOK, George Washington and Jefferson National Forests. This fire is located five miles southwest of Wardensville, West Virginia. No other information was reported.

BAY CREEK COMPLEX, Apalachicola National Forest. No significant activity occurred on the fire yesterday. Full containment is expected today.

POLE PINE, Florida State Division of Forestry. This fire is located in Pasco County. Mop-up is continuing.

WOLF CREEK, Florida State Division of Forestry. This fire is located in Osceola County. Extensive mop-up occurred yesterday.

OREANA, Winnemucca District, BLM. This fire is burning in sage and cheat grass 30 miles southwest of Imlay. One outbuilding was destroyed. Mop-up operations are continuing. Full containment was expected last night.

OUTLOOK:

Florida will be mostly clear with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. Winds will be variable at 5 to 15 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 80's to lower 90's.

Virginia will be mostly sunny and warmer. Winds will be west to northwest at 5 to 10 MPH, shifting to the south around 10 MPH in southeast Virginia. High temperatures will be in the 80's.

California will be mostly sunny, except for isolated mountain thunderstorms in the afternoon. Winds will be southwest to northwest at 10 to 20 MPH with gusts to 25 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 80's to 90's in the valleys and deserts and 100 to 105 in the deserts.

Arizona will be mostly clear with isolated afternoon thunderstorms mainly in the mountains. Minimum humidities will be 30 to 40% in the mountains and 10 to 20% at lower elevations. Winds will be south to west at 5 to 20 MPH. High temperatures will be in the 70's to 80's in the mountains and 90's to 105 in the lower elevations.

New Mexico will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms in the east and north. Winds will be variable at 10 MPH. High temperatures will be in the upper 50's to mid 70's in the mountains and to the north, with 80's and 90's elsewhere in the state.

West Texas will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's in the mountains, 90's in the lower elevations and around 100 along the Rio Grande.
