

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY, OCTOBER 18, 1999 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Moderate initial attack activity was reported in California with minimal initial attack reported elsewhere. New large fire activity occurred in the Southern California and Southern Areas. Large fire containment objectives were met in the Eastern Great Basin Area. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized helicopters, infrared aircraft, engines, crews, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, California, Idaho, and Utah.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

PENDOLA, Tahoe National Forest. A Unified Command with Type I Incident Management Team (Studebaker) and California Department of Forestry (Clarabut) are assigned. This fire is near Bullards Bar Reservoir west of Camptonville, CA and is burning in mixed conifer and manzanita. The fire is making major runs towards the small communities of Challenge and Laporte.

SIXTEEN, Sonoma-Lake-Napa Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. A State Incident Management Team (Stovall) is assigned. This fire is on the west side of Rumsey Canyon. Efforts are being made to hold the fire north of Butts Canyon Road and Pope Canyon Road.

JONES, Shasta-Trinity Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. A State Incident Management Team (Tarp) is assigned. This fire is two miles east of Redding, CA and is burning in grass and scrub oak. One hundred homes have been confirmed destroyed yesterday. Winds are much lighter. Most of the roads have been reopened and evacuations have been lifted.

BIG BAR COMPLEX, Shasta-Trinity National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Giachino) is assigned. The complex is 28 miles northwest of Weaverville, CA. The complex consists of the Megram and Onion fires. An inversion layer prevented air operations on most of the fire yesterday. Burning operations were initiated along the Tish Tang Road. Fireline was established in Bell Creek.

GEYSER, Sonoma-Lake-Napa Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. This fire is on Geyser Road, east of Geyserville, CA. Containment was expected last night.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

KIRK COMPLEX, Los Padres National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Roach) is assigned to the north Kirk Complex, which includes the Tassajara, Five and Mountain fires. A Type II Incident Management Team (Vittum) is assigned to the south Kirk Complex, which includes the Hare and Kirk fires. Crews continue conducting mop up operations. Good progress is being made on rehabilitation of firelines.

HELLMAN, San Bernardino Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. This fire is near Corona, CA. No other information was reported.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

LAMBS MEADOW, Wasatch-Cache National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Richer) is assigned. This fire is 40 miles southeast of Evanston, WY. Reduction of fire size is a result of Global Position System mapping. Cooler temperatures and higher relative humidities are aiding in suppression effort.

ALDER, Grand Teton National Park. This fire is near Moose, WY. Demobilization has begun.

OUTLOOK:

*** A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED FOR THIS MORNING FOR PARTS OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, MAINLY FOR CANYONS AND PASSES, FOR SANTA ANA WINDS AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY. ***

A dry ridge aloft over the west continues, with a thermal surface pressure trough over California and Oregon. A strong surface high pressure which was over the Intermountain west is weakening and will generate less wind by early morning. Very dry conditions continue over non-coastal areas of California, Oregon, Idaho, southeast Washington, Utah and Nevada. An upper impulse that moved across Washington yesterday is now over Wyoming.
