

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, OCTOBER 22, 1999 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Minimal initial attack activity was reported in most Geographic Areas. New large fires occurred in the Rocky Mountain and Eastern Areas. Containment objectives were met on large fires in the Northern California Area. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized a caterer, a shower unit, commissary, communication equipment, engines, meteorological equipment, infrared aircraft, helicopters, air tanker and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, California, Idaho, Utah, Wyoming, Nevada, Arizona and New Mexico.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

BIG BAR COMPLEX, Shasta-Trinity National Forest. An Area Command Team (Edrington) is assigned. A Unified Command with a Type I Incident Management Team (Giachino), A Type I Incident Management Team (Stutler) and the Hoopa Tribe is in place. The complex is 28 miles northwest of Weaverville, CA. The complex consists of the Megram and Onion fires. Burning operations continued in several divisions of the fire. The fire has advanced in the Cedar Creek drainage and to the fireline on Waterman Ridge.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

KIRK COMPLEX, Los Padres National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Roach) is assigned. This complex has been consolidated and includes the Hare, Kirk, Tassajara, Five and Mountain fires. The Incident Command Post is now at Arroyo Base. The fire made a 350 acre run around the Ventana Double Cone area. A main focus in suppression efforts is the Carmel River watershed and the Ventana Wilderness area.

OUTLOOK:

An intense high pressure ridge continues to dominate the weather over the western United States. A shallow marine layer will continue along the coastal areas of Washington, Oregon and California. The interior will continue to be very warm and dry with local inversions occurring during the early morning and nighttime hours. Mostly sunny skies are expected over most of the region, except morning low clouds and fog along the coast. Locally breezy conditions should develop over sections of southern California mainly through the passes and canyons. High temperatures will range from 55 to 65 along the coastal sections to the 60's and 70's over the interior valleys. High temperatures in the mountains of Idaho, Nevada and Utah will be in the 50's, while 80's and 90's will prevail over the deserts of southern California, Nevada and Utah.
