

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, OCTOBER 31, 1999 - 0900 MST
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was moderate in Southern California Area and minimal elsewhere. New large fires were reported in the Eastern Area. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized infrared aircraft. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, Utah, Wyoming, Arizona, Colorado, and Indiana.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

BIG BAR COMPLEX, Shasta-Trinity National Forest. An Area Command Team (Edrington) is assigned. A Unified Command with two Type I Incident Management Teams (Hutchinson and Stutler) and the Hoopa Tribe is assigned. The complex is 28 miles northwest of Weaverville, CA and consists of the Megram and Onion fires. Equipment that had been left on the fireline is being retrieved.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

KIRK COMPLEX, Los Padres National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Roach) is assigned. This complex includes the Hare, Kirk, Tassajara, Five, and Mountain fires. Demobilization continues in an effort to completely remove the camp by November 1.

EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

WAGNER LAKE, Huron-Manistee National Forest. This fire seven miles south of Mio, MI and is burning in Jack Pine. Low relative humidity is causing control problems.

CAMP ATTERBURY/CORDRY LAKE, Indiana State Forestry. This fire is at Camp Atterbury, IN and is burning in an old field and hardwoods. Current threats are to primary residences.

OUTLOOK:

A weak weather system will move across Oregon and southern Idaho bringing isolated to scattered rain showers over the valleys, and snow and rain showers over the mountains. An upper ridge of high pressure will bring relatively warm and dry conditions to the remainder of the area. Winds will stay below red flag criteria in southern California. High temperatures will range from the 40's to 50's over the mountains of Oregon, southern Idaho, northern Nevada, northern Utah, and western Colorado. High temperatures will be in the 50's and 60's over the mountains of California and southern Nevada. The valley high temperatures will range from the 50's over Oregon and southern Idaho, 50's and 60's in northern Nevada and northern Utah and 60's and 70's over southern Nevada, southern Utah and eastern Colorado. The valley high temperatures in California will range from the 60's over the north, and the mid 70's to mid 80's over the south.
