

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
WEDNESDAY, APRIL 12, 2000 - 1000 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION:

Crews made good progress on the large fires in the Southern and Southwest Areas. New large fires were reported in Kentucky, North Carolina, and Florida, but all are contained. Initial attack activity was moderate in the Southern Area, and minimal elsewhere. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona and Virginia.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

LUCERO, Southern Pueblos Agency, BIA. The fire is burning on the Isleta Pueblo, 10 miles south of Albuquerque, NM. Erratic winds yesterday caused the fire to remain active throughout the day. A strike team of engines worked the perimeter and mopped up hot spots.

WILLOW, Coconino National Forest. The fire is 40 miles south of Flagstaff, AZ. No new information was reported.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

MERRITT, Florida Division of Forestry. A Florida State Type II Incident Management Team has been assigned. The fire is burning 10 miles southwest of Naples, FL. One residence was destroyed yesterday. The current strategy is to keep the fire east of US Highway 951, where numerous improvements would be threatened. Poor access to the fire is hindering suppression efforts.

Florida will be mostly cloudy in the panhandle with a chance of showers and thunderstorms. Elsewhere in the state, conditions will be partly cloudy. High temperatures will be in the mid 70's in the north and in the mid 80's in the south. Winds will be northeast to southeast at 5 to 15 mph.
