

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
THURSDAY, APRIL 20, 2000 - 1000 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION:

The Northern Rockies, Rocky Mountain, and Eastern Areas reported new large fires. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, Colorado and Kansas.

SOUTHWEST LARGE FIRES:

RIO GRANDE COMPLEX, Socorro District, New Mexico State Forestry. This complex consists of six fires burning 30 to 60 miles south of Albuquerque, NM. A Type II Incident Management Team (Bustamante) is assigned. The fires are being contained at their current perimeters and mop-up operations are in progress. Current problems include high winds, low relative humidities and heavy fuels.

BRANTLEY, Roswell - Carlsbad Field Office, Bureau of Land Management. This fire is located 15 miles northwest of Carlsbad, NM. High winds, low relative humidities, and high temperatures are creating containment problems.

PICACHO, Capitan District, New Mexico State Forestry. The fire is burning east of Ruidoso, NM. Demobilization of some resources has begun.

SAND DUNES, Great Sand Dunes National Monument, National Park Service. This fire located 35 miles northeast of Alamosa, CO. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hartman) has been assigned. Evacuated residents were allowed to return to their homes last night.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN CENTRAL FLORIDA FOR LOW HUMIDITIES. ***

Florida will be partly cloudy with minimum relative humidities in the 32 to 38 percent range. Winds are forecast to be out of the east and southeast at 5 to 10 mph.

The southwest will be mostly sunny and warmer. High temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's with minimum relative humidities around 10 to 20 percent.

Colorado will be mostly sunny and warmer. High temperatures will be 60 to 70 degrees in the valleys and 50 to 60 degrees in the mountains. Minimum relative humidities in the mountains will range from 35 to 45 percent, and 20 to 30 percent elsewhere. Winds will be out of the southwest at 5 to 15 mph.
