

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
WEDNESDAY, JUNE 21, 2000 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in the Southern and Northwest Areas. Initial attack activity was light nationwide. Both Rocky Mountain Area large fires are contained and the Area Command Team has been demobilized. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized lead planes, infrared aircraft, a crew, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, Nevada, Utah, California, Colorado, Kansas, Florida, and Mississippi.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

An Area Command Team (Edrington) is assigned to manage the Cerro Grande and Viveash fires.

CERRO GRANDE, Bandelier National Park. Two Type II Incident Management Teams (Furlong and Ostman) are assigned. The fire is near Los Alamos, NM. Crews are nearing completion of rehabilitation projects identified by the Burned Area Emergency Rehabilitation Team.

VIVEASH, Santa Fe National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Rios) is assigned. This fire is burning in ponderosa pine and mixed conifer five miles northwest of Pecos, NM. Rehabilitation of the fireline is complete. Other rehabilitation projects have resumed. Roads closed due to mudslides on 6/19 have been reopened.

POT MOUNTAIN, Taos Field Office, BLM. This fire is burning in pinyon-juniper and sagebrush 30 miles northwest of Taos, NM. Containment is expected today.

OUTLOOK:

Arizona, New Mexico and southeast Colorado will have scattered thunderstorms. Nevada, Utah and the rest of Colorado will be mostly sunny. Temperatures will range from the 70's in the northern mountains up to 110 in desert areas. Winds will be south to west at 5 to 15 mph.

Minimum relative humidities will be 8 to 18 percent.

Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be from the mid 80's to the mid 90's. Winds will be southeast to southwest at 5 to 15 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 45 to 55 percent.

California will be sunny, hot and dry. High temperatures will range from the 70's along the coast to 108 in the deserts. Winds will be south to west at 10 to 20 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 10 to 20 percent.
