

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, JUNE 23, 2000 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in the Northwest, Southern California and Southern Areas. Initial attack activity increased in the Northwest, California, Southern, Rocky Mountain, and Great Basin Areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized a lead plane, engines, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, Nevada, Utah, Colorado, Oregon, California, Idaho, Kansas, and Mississippi.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

CERRO GRANDE, Bandelier National Park. A National Park Service All-Risk Management Team (Ziemann) is assigned. Crews continue to make progress on rehabilitation projects. The fire received light rain yesterday. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

VIVEASH, Santa Fe National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Rios) is assigned. This fire is burning in ponderosa pine and mixed conifer five miles northwest of Pecos, NM. Work on various rehabilitation projects continues. Crews are expected to reach 100 percent containment of the fire today.

WELLS, Inyo National Forest. This lightning-caused fire is near Bishop, CA. The fire is moving toward an old burn and a marsh area. High winds from passing thunderstorms are causing rapid spread and control problems.

threatened.

RAG, Sabine National Wildlife Refuge. The fire is 30 miles southeast of Beaumont, TX. Containment was expected last night.

OUTLOOK:

Arizona, New Mexico, Nevada, Utah, and southern Colorado will be partly cloudy as monsoonal moisture continues to spread northward across the area. Most areas will have scattered wet thunderstorms, except in southern Colorado where thunderstorms will be dry. High temperatures will range from the 70's in the northern mountains up to 105 in desert areas. Winds will be south to southwest at 10 to 20 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 20 to 35 percent in the mountains and 10 to 20 percent in the deserts.

Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms,

mainly in the eastern and southern parts of the state. High temperatures will be in the mid 90's. Winds will be south to southwest at 10 to 15 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 45 to 60 percent.

California's Sierra Nevada mountains will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon and evening thunderstorms. High temperatures will be from the 70's to the mid 80's. Minimum relative humidities will be 20 to 35 percent.
