

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, JUNE 24, 2000 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in the Rocky Mountain, Southern, Northwest, and Western Great Basin Areas. Initial attack activity was moderate to heavy in Florida, Nevada, Utah, and Colorado. Alaska is monitoring 19 fires for 20,900 acres. The National Interagency Coordination Center mobilized airtankers, lead planes, a helicopter, a caterer, radio equipment, engines, crews, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, Colorado, California, Utah, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Arizona, Kansas, and Mississippi.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

PIÑON CANYON, Pike-San Isabel National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Hartman) is assigned. The fire is burning in salt cedar, pinyon-juniper and grass south of La Junta, CO on the Comanche National Grasslands. Gusty winds from a passing thunderstorm drove the fire across the Purgatoire River and started spot fires up to 1/4 mile ahead. Steep canyon walls and heavy fuels are hindering suppression efforts.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

BASIN, Elko Field Office BLM. This fire is 22 miles southwest of Jiggs, NV. The fire is burning in heavy sage, pinyon-juniper and grass. Flame lengths of eight to ten feet have been observed.

TONKIN ROAD, Battle Mountain Field Office BLM. The fire is 75 miles south of Carlin, NV. Lightning ignited this fire on 6/22. Suppression forces worked the west side of the fire preventing it from burning over a ridge. Low humidities, windy conditions and difficult access are hampering control efforts.

BOX CANYON, Winnemucca Field Office BLM. This lightning-caused fire is ten miles north of Winnemucca, NV. Fuels are cheatgrass and sagebrush and one structure is threatened. Steep terrain and strong ridgetop winds are challenging containment efforts.

NORTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

RANGE, Yakima Agency BIA. This human-caused fire is south of Toppenish, WA. It is burning in grass and sagebrush. Engines and dozers are making progress toward containment.

SEATTLE FLAT, Prineville District BLM. This wind-driven fire is 11 miles north of Madras, OR. The fire has burned to Highway 97 and has caused the highway to be closed in two places. Two structures and several outbuildings are threatened. Fuels are sagebrush, juniper and grass.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

MUSE COMMAND, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is east of St. Cloud, FL in Osceola County. One residence was destroyed, and several other homes are threatened. Strong, shifting winds are causing containment problems.

WILDCOW, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is in Hendry County near Felda, FL. High winds are hampering containment efforts.

OUTLOOK:

*** A RED FLAG WARNING IS POSTED FOR SOUTHEAST IDAHO FOR STRONG WINDS THIS AFTERNOON ***

Idaho will have partly cloudy skies. High temperatures will be 65 to 75 in the mountains and up to 90 in the valleys. Winds will be west at 10 to 20 mph with stronger gusts in the eastern portion of the state. Minimum relative humidities will be 15 to 30 percent.

Arizona, New Mexico, Nevada, Utah, and southern Colorado will have scattered thunderstorms and showers, mainly over the mountainous areas. High temperatures will be 65 to 75 in the mountains and up to 105 in the southern deserts. Winds will be west to southwest at 10 to 20 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 15 to 30 percent at lower elevations and 25 to 40 percent in the mountains.

Florida will be partly cloudy with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. High temperatures will be 85 to 95. Winds will be south to southwest at 10 to 15 mph. Minimum relative humidities will be 45 to 60 percent.

California s Sierra Nevada mountains will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon and evening thunderstorms. High temperatures will be from the mid 70's to the mid 80's. Minimum relative humidities will be 20 to 35 percent.
