

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 FRIDAY, MARCH 17, 2000 - 1000 MST  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL I

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack and large fire activity in the Southwest, Southern, and Eastern Areas has been light to moderate since Monday. Demobilization of resources from the Southern Area is continuing. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in New Mexico, Arizona, Texas, Virginia, California, and Illinois.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

SOLDIER, Gila National Forest. This fire burning in ponderosa pine, 30 miles northeast of Silver City, NM. No other information was received.

OUTLOOK:

New Mexico will be mostly sunny to partly cloudy today and through the weekend, with temperatures between 45 and 75. Variable cloudiness will move into the state Monday and Tuesday. Conditions will be breezy and a little cooler, with a chance of showers and mountain snow showers. Wednesday and Thursday will continue cooler with a chance of showers.

Arizona will be clear today, with partly cloudy conditions moving in over the weekend. Northwest Arizona will be breezy. High temperatures will range from the low 50's in the mountains to the 90's in desert areas. There is a chance of showers in central and northeast Arizona on Monday

and Tuesday, with cooler temperatures. On Wednesday and Thursday, the southwest and south-central parts of the states will have below normal temperatures and a chance of showers.

Southern California coastal areas will be mostly clear to partly cloudy except for overnight low clouds and fog, with high temperatures in the mid 70's. The desert areas will be mostly clear and breezy over the weekend, with highs from the mid 60's to the upper 70's. Monday through Thursday will be partly cloudy with increasing winds and below normal temperatures. Southern California mountainous areas will be mostly clear and windy, with high temperatures in the 50's and 60's. Partly cloudy conditions will move in on Monday.

Indiana will have increasing clouds through the weekend, with a chance of showers mixed with snow in the north on Sunday. Monday through Thursday will be partly cloudy and warmer, with highs from the mid 50's to lower 60's.

Missouri will be mostly sunny to partly cloudy through the weekend, with temperatures in the 50's. Monday through Thursday, conditions will be clear to partly cloudy and warmer, with highs to the mid 60's.
