

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
TUESDAY, MAY 2, 2000 - 0530 MDT  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

A new large fire occurred in the Southwest Area. Fire managers and crews made good progress on large fires in the Southwest, Southern and Eastern Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, California, Oklahoma, Texas, Michigan and Wisconsin.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

COON CREEK, Tonto National Forest. A Type I Incident Management Team (Bateman) is assigned. The fire is 20 miles north of Globe, AZ in the Sierra Ancha Wilderness. Good progress was made on the western flank but the fire continues to burn actively in the steep topography. The fire is threatening a lookout tower and other cultural sites.

RIVER, Las Vegas District, New Mexico State Forestry. The fire is near Santa Rosa, NM. No other information was received.

POLK TANK, Lincoln National Forest. This fire is burning 40 miles west of Carlsbad, NM. The fire was contained yesterday due to cooler temperatures and higher relative humidities. Some demobilization should begin today.

MT. BRUCE, State Land Department. The fire is located seven miles east of Sonoita, AZ. The fire was started by a citizen burning debris around his house. Major concerns are for four other homes in the immediate area. The fire is burning in mixed desert shrub and chaparral.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

CLIFF LAKE, National Forests of Florida. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. This fire is nine miles north of Sumatra, FL in the Apalachicola National Forest. Firelines were secured due to a successful burnout yesterday and no significant problems were experienced. Fire management is considering some highway closures due to heavy smoke during the night and early morning hours.

ELLS BRANCH, Daniel Boone National Forest. This fire is nine miles north of Manchester, KY and started on private land. Rainfall assisted in control efforts.

#### EASTERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

NO PABLO, Huron-Manistee National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Colla) is assigned. The fire is burning 10 miles southeast of Mio, MI in jack pine. The fire was active with crowning and spotting up to 1/4 of a mile due to high winds. The immediate threat to homes in the area has currently passed as air operations in the area were successful in slowing fire growth.

#### OUTLOOK:

Eastern Michigan will be mostly sunny after a few morning clouds. High temperatures will be around 60 degrees and winds will be out of the north at 5 to 10 mph.

Central Arizona will be mostly sunny and hot. High temperatures will be in the mid 90's to 100 degrees in the lower elevations. Winds will be westerly at 5 to 15 mph. New Mexico will be sunny and warmer with southeast winds from 5 to 15 mph.

Northwest Florida will be partly cloudy with high temperatures in the mid 80's. Winds will be southerly at 5 to 10 mph in the morning becoming southwesterly in the afternoon.
