

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, MAY 21, 2000 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in the Southern and Southwest Areas. The Southern Area had moderate initial attack activity, while activity in the rest of the nation was light. Fire fighters in the Southwest Area are meeting containment objectives and demobilization continues. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for a lead plane, infrared aircraft, engines, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Texas, and Utah.

On 5/13, Interior Secretary Bruce Babbitt and Agriculture Secretary Dan Glickman announced a 30-day suspension of all federal prescribed fires west of the 100th meridian. For more information, see the U.S. Forest Service Fire web page at www.fs.fed.us/fire/news.shtml.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

CERRO GRANDE, Bandelier National Monument. An Area Command Team (Meuchel) and a Type I Incident Management Teams (Gage) are assigned. The fire is burning near Los Alamos, NM. Fire intensities continue to be low with the cloudy and cool weather conditions. Construction of direct line and aggressive mop-up continue on the west side of the fire between Santa Clara Canyon and Cerro Grande.

OUTLET, Grand Canyon National Park. A Type I Incident Management Team (Frye) is assigned. The fire is located in designated and proposed wilderness 25 miles south of Jacob Lake, AZ. Fire activity increased with warmer temperatures yesterday, but no increase in acreage. Mop-up and fire line improvement continues. Demobilization of personnel is in progress.

SINGLETON, New Mexico State - Las Vegas District. This fire is 30 miles north of Tucumcari, NM. This fire was caused by lightning and is burning in mesquite, grass and juniper. Access is hindering suppression efforts.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

LONG BAY, National Forests of Florida. A Type II Incident Management Team (Wilkins) is assigned. The fire is in the Apalachicola National Forest, 40 miles southwest of Tallahassee, FL. There has been little change from yesterday. Infrared detection showed several hot spots within the interior which will continue to be monitored.

CARLTON RESERVE, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is ten miles northwest of Port Charlotte, FL. Some spotting has been observed. Crews are mopping up 100 feet in from the fireline, and continue to reinforce the perimeter fireline.

SQUIRREL COMMAND, Florida Division of Forestry. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

MICROWAVE COMMAND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Osceola County located in swamp land. Southwest winds are expected by Monday.

POINT PETER, Alligator River National Wildlife Refuge. This fire is three miles south of Mann s Harbor, NC. Air tankers, helicopters, and dozers are being utilized in suppression efforts. A sudden wind shift caused a 250 acreage increase mid-afternoon.

CAMP LEJUNE, North Carolina. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED FOR MUCH OF INLAND FLORIDA SUNDAY AFTERNOON FOR LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITIES ***

A weak cold front will move through Alabama and Georgia Sunday bringing a chance of showers and thunderstorms. The northern part of the front will stall over North and South Carolina with cloudy skies and a chance of showers and thunderstorms. Florida will continue to be sunny and dry with afternoon minimum relative humidities of 30 to 40 percent in the interior

portion of the state.

Arizona and New Mexico will be sunny with high temperatures in the 70s and 80s. Minimum relative humidities will be 10 to 20 percent. West Texas will have a slight chance of thunderstorms during the day.
