

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 MONDAY, MAY 22, 2000 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in the Southern Area. The Southern and Southwest Areas had moderate initial attack activity, while activity in the remainder of the nation was light. Demobilization is underway for the large fires in the Southwest Area. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for radio equipment and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, Texas, and Oklahoma.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

CERRO GRANDE, Bandelier National Monument. An Area Command Team (Meuchel) and a Type I Incident Management Team (Gage) are assigned. The fire is located near Los Alamos, NM. Isolated smokes still exists within the fire's perimeter in unburned islands. No torching or fire spread was observed yesterday, though fire activity increased somewhat with afternoon heating. Aggressive mop-up on the west side of the fire between Santa Clara Canyon and Cerro Grande continues.

SINGLETON, Las Vegas District, New Mexico State Forestry. This fire is 30 miles north of Tucumcari, NM. Dozers constructed firelines on the north, west and south flanks of the fire. Crews planned to complete a burnout operation on the remote east flank last night.

OUTLET, Grand Canyon National Park. A Type I Incident Management Team (Frye) is assigned. The fire is located in a designated and proposed wilderness 25 miles south of Jacob Lake, AZ. The fire was contained yesterday. All North Rim facilities will reopen today. Transition to a Type III organization is planned for 5/23.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

CARLTON RESERVE, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is ten miles northwest of Port Charlotte, FL. Control problems include heavy fuels, remote location and continued drought conditions. Transition to the local district is planned for 5/23.

MICROWAVE COMMAND, Florida State Division of Forestry. This fire is burning in swamp land in Osceola County. Approximately 16,000 gallons of

retardant was dropped on this fire yesterday. LONG BAY, National Forests of Florida. A Type II Incident Management Team (Wilkins) is assigned. The fire is located in the Apalachicola National Forest, 40 miles southwest of Tallahassee, FL. Containment was expected late last night.

RIVER RANCH, Florida State Division of Forestry. This fire is in Polk County, FL. The fire destroyed approximately 113 hunting camps which consisted of tents and trailers. Dense palmetto fuels hindered containment efforts.

Arizona, New Mexico and west Texas will continue to be hot and dry. Isolated thunderstorms are possible over the west Texas and southern New Mexico mountains. High temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's. Minimum relative humidities will be 5 to 15 percent. Winds will be light and variable.

A weak cold front will move through Florida today, bringing mostly cloudy skies and a few showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's. Minimum relative humidities will be 40 to 50 percent. Winds will be light.

North and South Carolina will be partly cloudy with widely scattered afternoon showers and thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the 80's.
