

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, MAY 27, 2000 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL III

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in Florida and New Mexico. Initial attack activity was light to moderate in most areas. The National Interagency Coordination Center processed orders for airtankers, helicopters, air attack and infrared aircraft, engines, shower units, radio equipment, meteorological equipment, crews, and miscellaneous overhead. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Utah, Colorado, Kansas, and Oklahoma.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

PUMPKIN, Kaibab National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Anderson) is assigned. The fire is 25 miles northeast of Flagstaff, AZ and has burned into the Kendrick Wilderness Area. No new information was received.

STOOGES COMPLEX, Kaibab National Forest. This complex consists of the MANGUM and OAK POINT fires. A Type II Incident Management Team (Joki) is assigned. These lightning caused fires are ten miles southwest of Jacob Lake, AZ. No new information was received.

GORGE, Cibola National Forest. The fire is 39 miles southwest of Socorro, NM. This lightning caused fire is within 1/2 mile of a wilderness area. High winds are predicted for today. Airtankers are being used to prevent the wildfire from entering nearby steep canyons and ponderosa pine fuels.

CLOVER, Coconino National Forest. The fire is burning in ponderosa pine 55 miles southeast of Flagstaff, AZ. No new information was received.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

KINSEY 2, Francis Marion and Sumter National Forests. A Type I Incident Management Team (Melton) is assigned. This complex of eight fires is burning near Cordesville, SC in long needle pine and southern rough. The fire received one inch of rain in the past 24 hours and is now contained.

CAT HOUSE, Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge. The fire is burning in heavy duff near the Kennedy Space Center east of Titusville, FL.

Control problems include extremely dry conditions, shifting winds and spotting.

DM, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is burning in swampland and heavy fuels south of Ocala in Sumpter County. High winds, low relative humidities and spotting are causing containment problems. Commercial timber is threatened.

CROOKED PINES, Florida State Division of Forestry. The fire is burning in heavy fuels and swampland in Lake County, FL. Two helicopters and airtankers are working the fire. Current threat is to commercial timber.

TAHQUITZ, San Bernardino National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Conklin) is assigned. The fire is 16 miles east of Hemet, CA. Current threat is to Mount San Jacinto State Park. Containment problems include difficult access and heavy fuels.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN EAST AND CENTRAL FLORIDA FOR LOW AFTERNOON RELATIVE HUMIDITIES ***

Florida will be partly cloudy with isolated showers and thunderstorms in the southern part of the state. High temperatures will be in the 90's. Winds will be southwest to west at 10 to 15 mph. Minimum afternoon relative humidities will be 30 to 40 percent.

Arizona and New Mexico will be mostly sunny. Winds will be west to southwest at 10 mph. High temperatures will be 75 to 85 in the mountains and up to 110 in the deserts. Minimum relative humidities will be 5 to 15 percent.

South Carolina will be partly cloudy with isolated afternoon showers and thunderstorms. Winds will be east at 5 to 10 mph. High temperatures will

be in the 80's. Minimum relative humidities will be 35 to 45 percent.

Southern California will be mostly sunny and warmer, with morning low clouds along the coast. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the mountains and in the 90's inland. Desert temperatures will reach 110. Winds will be southwest at 10 to 15 mph. Minimum relative humidities for the inland area will be 15 to 25 percent.
