

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, 2000 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL II

CURRENT SITUATION:

One new large fire was reported in the Southern Area. Containment was reached on two large fires, one in the Southern Area, and one in the Eastern Great Basin Area. Initial attack activity was light in all areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Oregon, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Nevada, Oklahoma and Texas.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

GULLY SLOUGH, Mackay Island National Wildlife Refuge. This fire is burning on private and federal land 45 miles east of Houston, TX. Fireline construction objectives are being met.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

VALENTINE COMPLEX, Valentine National Wildlife Refuge. This complex of seven lightning-caused fires is 25 miles south of Valentine, NE. Mopup and rehabilitation continue. No new information was reported.

NORTHERN ROCKIES AREA LARGE FIRES:

VALLEY COMPLEX, Bitterroot National Forest. A Type II Incident Management Team (Furlong) is assigned. These fires are seven miles south of Darby, MT. The complex consists of the Bear, Taylor, Taylor Spot, Hilltop, Razor, Fat, and Mink fires. The Blodgett fire and the Skalkaho Complex are now included in this complex. The adjustments to acreage and costs reflect this change. Fire activity has become more active with the warmer temperatures and lower humidity. Crews are making good progress on rehabilitation efforts.

MUSSIGBROD COMPLEX, Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest. These fires are 12 miles northwest of Wisdom, MT. The complex includes the Mussigbrod and Maynard fires. Rehabilitation plans for the main fire area are being initiated. Road closures continue to be patrolled.

MIDDLE FORK COMPLEX, Beaverhead-Deerlodge National Forest. These fires are 30 miles southwest of Philipsburg, MT. The complex consists of the Falls Creek, Cougar Creek, Coyote Springs, Medicine Lake, Skalkaho Pass, Lick Creek, and Cooper Creek fires. Rehabilitation continues.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI FOR LOW FUEL MOISTURES ***

Oklahoma, Texas and the Gulf Coast states can expect sunny skies. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's, with afternoon relative humidity ranging from 25 to 40 percent. Winds will be from the southeast or northeast at 10 to 15 mph.

A dry airmass continues to dominate the western and central United States as high pressure aloft remains over the Rocky Mountains. The Western Great Basin can expect some isolated showers and thunderstorms from a weak disturbance moving in from the south. High pressure will begin to shift east as a weak trough approaches the west coast. High temperatures will range from the 60's to 70's in the Pacific Northwest and into the 80's and 90's in southern Oregon and California. Afternoon minimum relative

humidity will range from 20 to 40 percent and winds will be southwest to northwest at 10 to 15 mph.
