

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 23, 2001 - 1000 MST  
NATIONAL PREPARDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

The Southern Area reported eight new large fires this past week, with seven large fires reaching containment. Initial attack activity was reported on a daily basis in the Southern Area. A high pressure system is expected to return to the Southern Area, with partly cloudy skies across much of the region and high temperatures returning to near normal.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

STAGECOACH, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is near Lakeland, FL. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Jones) is assigned. No structures have been lost.

BIG BEND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in monitor status.

TORY ISLAND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is near Homestead, FL and is in monitor status.

RED BEACH, Florida Division of Forestry. Fire crews continued to work spot fires.

FLICKA, Florida Division of Forestry. No other information was received.

BAHIA, Florida Division of Forestry. No other information was received.

#### OUTLOOK:

The South will have high pressure move back into the region today. Skies will be mostly clear to partly cloudy across much of the region, with a slight chance of showers across parts of central Florida. High temperatures should return to near normal, ranging from the mid 60's to the north part of the region, to the lower 80's in Florida.

A ridge of high pressure will build into Northern California today, while the latest Pacific storm drifts eastward into the Rockies. Snow will spread across much of the Central Rockies, extending northward into western Wyoming, southern Idaho and southwestern Montana. Fair weather is expected across the Pacific Northwest down through much of California for much of the day. Another frontal system is expected to begin moving inland on Saturday. High temperatures will range from the 20's across the Northern and Central Rockies to the mid 40's in the Pacific Northwest.

Rain showers are expected across the southern reaches of Arizona and New Mexico, while there is a possibility of snow in the northern mountains of the Southwestern States. High temperatures will be in the upper 60's for most of the Desert Southwest.

Moisture will be drawn into the Midwest by a strong low pressure system moving into the Plains. Snow showers will occur in the Northern Plains, while most locations south of Kansas to south Texas will see rain showers. By tomorrow afternoon, central Texas and Oklahoma will have a good chance of thunderstorms. East of the Mississippi River a high pressure system will continue with mostly clear to partly cloudy skies and light winds. High temperatures in the Midwest will range from the teens in the Northern Plains to the 70's in southern Texas.

A high pressure system building from the Great Lakes will push most of the snow showers out of New England. Clouds will dissipate producing mostly clear skies across most of the Northeast and winds will be gusty. Most of the Northeast will see high temperatures in the 30's, with warmer

temperatures southward to Virginia in the 50's.
