

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
 FRIDAY, JULY 6, 2001 - 0530 MDT  
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Twelve new large fires were reported, four in Rocky Mountain, six in the Great Basin, and one each in the Southwest and Southern Areas. Eight large fires were contained, five in Western Great Basin, and one each in northern California, Eastern Great Basin and Southern Area. Initial attack activity was moderate to heavy in most Geographic Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Kansas, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah and Wyoming.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

FISHERMAN COMPLEX, Bridger-Teton National Forest. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Hart) is assigned. This complex of fires are near Bondurant, WY. Long range, stand replacing runs were observed. Structures are potentially threatened.

NEBO CREEK, Uinta National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Suwyn) is assigned. This fire is near Spanish Fork, UT. Winds from passing thunderstorms continued to keep the fire active.

HARRISON, Northwest State, Utah State, This fire is five miles south of Tooele, UT. Extremely dry fuels and steep terrain are impeding containment efforts. Current threats are to critical deer and elk habitat.

NORTH CAN, Lower Snake River District, BLM. This lightning ignited fire is 15 miles southwest of Rogerson, ID. Air resources were utilized with containment efforts.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

WEST PEQUOPS, Elko Field Office, BLM. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Burdick) is assigned. This fire is burning in sagebrush, pinyon pine and juniper 17 miles northeast of Wells, NV. Torching and running were observed in isolated sections of the fire. Some precipitation was received, and crews made good progress with fireline construction.

NEPTUNE, Elko Field Office, BLM. This fire is burning in pinyon pine and juniper 35 miles southeast of Wells, NV. No further information was received.

ISOLATED, Elko Field Office, BLM. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Saleen) is assigned. This fire is 45 miles northeast of Elko, NV and is burning in sagebrush and grass. Passing thunderstorms caused the fire to make runs. Structure protection is being maintained on nearby ranches. The Isolated and Double Mountain incidents have been combined to form the Isolation Complex.

METROPOLIS, Northern Region, Nevada Division of Forestry. This fire is eight miles north of Wells, NV. No new information was received.

BISHOP, Northern Region, Nevada Division of Forestry. This fire is 15 miles northeast of Wells, NV. No new information was received. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

TIPTON, Winnemucca Field Office, BLM. This fire in near Winnemucca, NV.

ADELAIDE, Winnemucca Field Office, BLM. The nearest town to this fire is Winnemucca, NV. Fire activity was limited to interior smokes and a few flare-ups along the perimeter.

STANDARD, Winnemucca Field Office, BLM. This fire is near Winnemucca, NV. Light precipitation was received on the fire. Crews continue to make good progress with fireline construction and mopup.

WINECUP, Elko Field Office, BLM. This fire is burning in grass and sagebrush, 30 miles northeast of Wells, NV. Burnout operations for structure protection were successful. Major runs on the fire were observed. Current threats are to wildlife habitat, a livestock allotment, and the California Trail.

EGBERT, Elko Field Office, BLM. This fire is south of Wells, NV. Current threats are to a grazing allotment.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

JACK SPRINGS, Dinosaur National Monument. This fire is 50 miles northwest of Maybell, CO. Torching and spotting was observed on the east perimeter.

EAST GREASEWOOD, Craig District, BLM. This fire is 19 miles east of Rangely CO. Intense fire behavior has been observed, with long distant spotting, crowning and running. The fire escaped containment lines forcing personnel to safety zones.

BROKEN TRACK, Craig District, BLM. This lightning caused fire is 11 miles east of Rangely, CO. Wind events from passing thunderstorms pushed the fire outside of containment lines. One hundred foot flame lengths and short range spotting was observed.

SMITH CANYON, Casper District, BLM. This fire is 45 miles west of Casper, WY. Intense fire behavior was observed with major runs and torching.

CEDAR DRAW, Casper District, BLM. This fire is 16 miles north of Gillette, WY. The fire is burning along Highway 59, which was closed for three hours yesterday. Active fire behavior was observed with crowning and torching.

ALMONT, Grand Mesa-Uncompahgre-Gunnison National Forest. This fire is burning in sagebrush, grass and some timber, near Almont, CO.

KELLOG, Craig District, BLM. This fire is 12 miles northwest of Meeker, CO within the Black Mountain Wilderness Study Area. This fire is being monitored by air resources. The fire was relatively quiet, with some activity observed on the south perimeter.

BEAR SPRINGS, Pinon Canyon Maneuver Site, Department of Defense. This fire is 50 miles southeast of La Junta, CO. No new information was reported.

OUTLOOK:

Monsoonal moisture continues over the Great Basin bringing scattered

showers and thundershowers. High temperatures will be in the 80's and 90's, except near 105 in southern Nevada. Minimum relative humidity will range from 15 to 30 percent, and winds will be southwest at 5 to 15 mph.

High pressure over Colorado will bring partly cloudy skies with widely scattered thunderstorms, some with dry lightning. High temperatures will be 85 to 100, and minimum relative humidity will range from 10 to 25 percent. Winds will be variable at 5 to 15 mph.

California will have drier weather to the north, with monsoonal moisture residing over the southern part of the state. This will bring mostly sunny conditions to the north, with scattered showers and thundershowers to the south. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's along the coast, 80's and 90's inland, and near 105 in the deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range from 15 to 30 percent inland. Winds will be southwest to northwest at 10 to 20 mph.
