

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
THURSDAY, JULY 26, 2001 - 0530 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Five new large fires were reported, two in Idaho, and one each in California, Colorado, and Nevada. Initial attack activity was moderate in Northern California, Northwest, Eastern Great Basin, and Southwest Areas, and light elsewhere. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Texas, Utah and Wyoming.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

GREEN KNOLL, Bridger-Teton National Forest. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Carvelho) is assigned. This fire is 6 miles southwest of Jackson, WY. Extreme fire behavior and significant spotting was observed as the fire moved northeast, crossing Mosquito Creek near Cottonwood road. A unified command with Teton County Fire Department has been established. Mandatory evacuations were declared for the Indian Paintbrush, Crescent H Ranch subdivisions and other residences along Fall Creek road. Fall Creek road has been closed to public access.

SNOWSHOE, Salmon-Challis National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Saleen) is ordered and will transition at 0900 on 7/26. This fire is 25 miles northwest of Stanley, ID. Steep terrain, limited access, and heavy fuel loading are hampering containment efforts. Spotting up to one eighth of a mile ahead of the front was observed and the fire remains active on the south and east flanks.

SAGE, Sawtooth National Forest. This fire, burning in grass, sagebrush and timber, is 3 miles west of Ketchum, Idaho on Bald Mountain. The fire made significant runs, with torching and spotting being observed. Approximately 150 structures were threatened yesterday afternoon. The Adams Gulch trailhead was closed

ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

MAD CREEK, Routt National Forest. This fire is in the Mount Zirkel Wilderness Area, 11 miles north of Steamboat Springs, CO. The fire made significant runs in heavy blow down, and extreme fire behavior due to passing thunderstorms was observed. Additional resources have been

ordered.

ECKLUND COMPLEX, Little Snake Field Office, BLM. A Fire Use Management Team (Cook) is assigned. This complex of lightning caused Wildland Fire Use fires is in the Diamond Breaks Wilderness Study Area, 50 miles east of Vernal, UT. The Ecklund and Davis Draw fires are burning in very steep and rugged terrain. Occasional torching was observed on the Ecklund fire. The Davis Draw fire will be placed in monitoring status later today.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

TABOR CREEK, Elko Field Office, BLM. This fire, burning in grass and sagebrush, is 13 miles north of Metropolis, NV. The southwest flank of the fire is actively burning on a plateau and in rolling hills. No control problems are anticipated at this time.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AREA LARGE FIRES:

BRICEBURG, Madera-Mariposa-Merced Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. This fire is located near Highway 140, 15 miles east of Mariposa, CA. Gusty winds, steep slopes, and heavy fuel loading are impeding containment efforts. Numerous primary residences and outbuildings were threatened late yesterday.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES

PINE, Prescott National Forest. This lightning caused fire, which started on 7/2, is in the Pine Mountain and Cedar Bench Wilderness Areas, 18 miles southeast of Camp Verde, AZ. The fire was very active in decadent stands

of chaparral, making short runs with some torching. A confinement strategy is in place and the fire remains well within the identified containment area.

BASIN, Shasta-Trinity National Forest. This fire, burning in timber and mixed brush, is 35 miles southwest of Redding, CA. Acreage change is due to better mapping. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

NEW RIVER FLOOD, New River Gorge National River. This incident, near Glen Jean, WV, has transitioned to a local Type 3 organization to assist with recovery operations. Technical Specialists continue to identify serious hazards and make damage assessments of cultural sites and natural resources. Road crews are repairing the Thayer River access road. This will be the last report unless significant activity occurs.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH HAS BEEN POSTED IN PORTIONS OF SOUTHWEST AND CENTRAL WYOMING FOR DRY FUELS, INCREASING WINDS, VERY WARM TEMPERATURES, AND LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY ***

High pressure over Nevada and an upper level low over Utah will bring partly cloudy to mostly sunny skies to the Great Basin. Scattered, wet thunderstorms are forecast for most of Utah with isolated, mainly dry thunderstorms in northeast Nevada and northwest Utah. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the mountains, 80's to 100 at lower

elevation, and 90 to 110 in the southern deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range from 5 to 15 percent in Nevada and 15 to 20 percent in the lower elevations of Utah. Winds will be south to west at 5 to 20 mph.

High pressure over California will bring sunny skies to the area with isolated thundershowers in the Sierra Nevada Mountains. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's along the coast, 80's and 90's inland, and 100 to 110 in the southern deserts and northern inland areas. Minimum relative humidity will range from 10 to 25 percent inland, and winds will be south to west at 8 to 18 mph.

A weak upper level low over Utah and high pressure over central Texas will bring sunny, hot, and dry conditions to the Southwest. Scattered thunderstorms are forecast for portions of the Texas panhandle, much of New Mexico and northeastern Arizona. High temperatures will be in the 70's and 80's in the mountains, with 90 to 110 in the lowland deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range from 10 to 20 percent in west Texas and east New Mexico, and 15 to 30 percent elsewhere. Winds will be south to west at 5 to 20 mph.

A southwest flow continues to bring monsoonal moisture to the Rocky Mountain Area. Partly cloudy to mostly sunny skies with isolated to scattered afternoon and evening thundershowers are expected. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's in the mountains, and upper 70's to low 80's at lower elevation. Minimum relative humidity will range from 10 to 15 percent in southwest Wyoming, 20 to 30 percent in west Wyoming and northern Colorado, and 30 to 40 percent in southern Colorado. Winds will be west to southwest at 5 to 15 mph, except 15 to 25 mph in southwest Wyoming.
