

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, JULY 27, 2001 - 0530 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Two new large fires were reported, one each in northern California and Nevada. Two large fires were contained, one in northern California and one in Idaho. Initial attack activity was light nationwide. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

GREEN KNOLL, Bridger-Teton National Forest. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Carvelho) is assigned. This fire is 6 miles southwest of Jackson, WY. A unified command with Teton County Fire Department has been established. Mandatory evacuations are still in effect for Indian Paintbrush and Crescent H. Ranch subdivisions and residences along Fall Creek road. Fall Creek Road is closed to public access. The fire burned actively yesterday afternoon. Flames are visible on the ridge above the Wilson area. Fire spread continues in a northerly and easterly direction.

SNOWSHOE, Salmon-Challis National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Saleen) is assigned. This fire is 25 miles northwest of Stanley, ID. Resource mobilization is progressing. Additional resources will be arriving this morning.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

TABOR CREEK, Elko Field Office, BLM. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Murphy) will transition today. This fire, burning in grass and sagebrush, is 13 miles north of Metropolis, NV. The fire continued to burn actively throughout the night as a wind event passed over the area. Current threats are to power lines, livestock and wildlife habitat.

IBAPAH, Eastern Nevada Agency, BIA. This lightning caused fire is 50 miles south of Wendover, NV on the Goshute Indian Reservation. Crews are making progress towards containment.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AREA LARGE FIRES:

BRICEBURG, Sierra National Forest. A Unified Command with a California Department of Forestry Type 2 Incident Management Team (Hodson) and a National Type 2 Incident Management Team (Rios) is in place. This fire is located near Highway 140, 15 miles east of Mariposa, CA. Moderate rates of fire spread were observed last night. Direct fireline construction is progressing and secondary fireline construction utilizing heavy equipment is underway.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

MAD CREEK, Routt/Medicine Bow National Forest. This fire is in the Mount Zirkel Wilderness Area, 11 miles north of Steamboat Springs, CO. Some precipitation has been received slowing fire spread, though it continues to burn actively in an old blow down. Additional crews will arrive today.

ECKLUND COMPLEX, Little Snake Field Office, BLM. A Fire Use Management Team (Cook) is assigned. This complex of lightning caused Wildland Fire Use fires is in the Diamond Breaks Wilderness Study Area, 50 miles east of Vernal, UT. Very little activity was observed on the Davis Draw and Ecklund fires. Line construction and preparation for burnout operations continue on the Ecklund fire.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES

VISTA, Grand Canyon National Park. A Fire Use Management Team (Zimmerman) is assigned. This lightning caused Wildland Fire Use fire, which started on 7/15, is five miles east of the North Rim of the park. Low rates of spread with minimal torching in internal pockets of unburned fuel was observed yesterday. Mitigation of risks to sensitive resources in the area remains a concern. The Cape Royal Road from the Point Imperial Junction to Cape Royal remains closed to visitor use.

PINE, Prescott National Forest. This lightning caused fire, which started on 7/2, is in the Pine Mountain and Cedar Bench Wilderness Areas, 18 miles southeast of Camp Verde, AZ. The fire has made small runs into Skeleton Ridge. No other information was received.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH HAS BEEN POSTED IN WEST AND SOUTHWEST WYOMING FOR WINDS, LOW RELATIVE HUMIDITY, DRY FUELS AND WARM TEMPERATURES ***

A low pressure residing over California is now moving across the Rockies. This low is expected to be east of the region, resulting in a transition to a drier westerly flow. This will bring partly sunny skies with isolated showers and afternoon thunderstorms to eastern Wyoming. Colorado will be partly sunny with isolated afternoon thunderstorms to the western slope of the Rockies, and scattered afternoon thunderstorms along the front range. High temperatures will be in the 70's in the mountains, and in the 80's at lower elevations. Minimum relative humidity will range from 15 to 20 percent in western Wyoming, and 20 to 35 percent elsewhere. Colorado will have minimum relative humidity ranging from 20 to 30 percent in the front range, and 15 to 30 percent along the western slope. Winds will be west to southwest at 15 to 25 mph with gusts to 40 mph in western Wyoming, west at 10 to 20 mph in the south, and variable at 5 to 20 mph east. Colorado will have variable winds at 6 to 12 mph.

The Great Basin will have a drier westerly flow aloft. This will bring

partly cloudy skies with isolated afternoon thunderstorms to Utah. Central and southern Idaho will be sunny. High temperatures will be 75 to 85 in the mountains, and 85 to 95 at lower elevations. Minimum relative humidity will range from 15 to 25 percent at lower elevations of Utah, and 25 to 35 percent in the mountains. Idaho will have minimum relative humidity ranging from 5 to 18 percent. Winds will be west to southwest at 10 to 20 mph, mainly along the ridges.

High pressure will maintain warm temperatures, low relative humidity and light winds over Nevada. High temperatures will be 85 to 100, except 105 to 114 in southern portions of the state. Minimum relative humidity will range from 7 to 14 percent. Winds will be southwest to west at 5 to 15 mph.
