

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
FRIDAY, JUNE 1, 2001 - 0530 MDT  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in Florida and Colorado. Two large fires were contained in Florida and one in Mississippi. Initial attack activity was moderate in Northern California, Southwest and Southern Areas and light elsewhere. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, Idaho, Montana, New Mexico, Oregon, Texas and Utah.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

SILVER EAGLE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is burning in a large dry lakebed and swamp area near Groveland, FL. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

DIXIE/LAFAYETTE COMPLEX, Florida Division of Forestry. A State Type 2 Incident Management Team (Koehler) is assigned. No new information was reported.

MCNELLY, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is close to the Punta Gorda Air Force Base, Punta Gorda, FL. The fire threatened several homes and Highway 31.

776, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Charlotte County near Englewood, FL. This will be the last report unless additional information is received.

BOG HOLE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is burning in a large dry swamp in Sumter County, FL. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received. CRAVEN ISLAND, Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. A Fire Use Management Team (Cook) is assigned. This fire is near Minnies Island, GA. No new information was reported.

BLOUT PASTURE, Georgia State Forestry Commission. The fire is near Darian, GA. in McIntosh County. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

ARABIA BAY, Georgia State Forestry Commission. The fire is near Homerville, GA in Clinch County. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

LEMONS GAP COMPLEX, Texas State Forest Service. This fire is burning in grass, pinyon pine and juniper 32 miles east of Marathon, TX. This complex is comprised of the Lemons Gap, Right Hand Canyon and Pine Peak fires. The Pine Peak fire is threatening a subdivision and an evacuation plan is in place. Engines are providing structure protection. Helicopters and air tankers are providing substantial support to ground personnel. Steep terrain, winds and low relative humidity are impeding suppression efforts.

#### SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

HIDDEN COMPLEX, Lincoln National Forest. Type 2 Incident Management Team (Garcia) is assigned. These lightning caused fires are 30 miles southwest of Carlsbad, NM. This complex includes the Hidden, Devils Den and Wilderness fires. The Hidden and Wilderness fires are in mopup stages. On Devils Den, the interior is still active with the potential for spotting. Ground forces with aerial support continue to work on securing control lines and mopup.

DEVIL, Lassen-Modoc Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. A State Type 1 Incident Management Team (Johnson) is assigned. This fire is five miles west of Susanville, CA.

BLACK DIAMOND, Craig District, BLM. This fire is one-half mile west of Meeker, CO. Structures are threatened and ground resources are in place for structure protection. Containment efforts are being hampered by steep, inaccessible terrain.

#### OUTLOOK:

\*\*\* A FIRE WEATHER WATCH HAS BEEN POSTED IN NORTHERN CALIFORNIA DUE TO STRONG SOUTHWEST TO WEST WINDS \*\*\*

An approaching Pacific trough will bring increasing winds and cooler temperatures to northern portions of California. California will be mostly sunny except for low clouds along the coast. High temperatures will be in the 60's along the coast and 90 to 105 in the inland valleys. Minimum relative humidity will range from 10 to 25 percent in the inland valleys. Winds will be southwest to west at 15 to 30 mph over the northern mountains, otherwise variable at 5 to 15 mph.

High pressure is building from the west over Texas bringing partly cloudy skies with widely scattered showers and thundershowers. High temperatures will be 75 to 85 in the mountains to 105 in the lowest valleys. Minimum relative humidity will range from 15 to 25 percent in the west, otherwise generally 25 to 45 percent. Winds will be southwest at 15 to 25 mph in west Texas, and 5 to 15 mph elsewhere.

High pressure over Arizona and New Mexico will bring sunny skies except for a few thunderstorms in eastern New Mexico. High temperatures will be 75 to 85 in the mountains and 105 to 115 in the deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range from 5 to 15 percent. Winds will be southwest to northwest at 5 to 15 mph.

Florida will have mostly cloudy skies with widely scattered showers statewide. High temperatures will be in the 80's with minimum relative humidity above 45 percent. Winds will be south to southwest at 10 to 15 mph.
