

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, JUNE 3, 2001 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in New Mexico, northern California, Florida, Nevada and Idaho. Crews reached containment objectives on large fires in Nevada, Idaho and Florida. Initial attack activity was moderate in Northern California and Southern Area, and light elsewhere. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, Colorado, New Mexico, Texas and Utah.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

TRAP AND SKEET, Mescalero Agency, BIA. A Type 1 Incident Management Team (Humphrey) is assigned. This fire started three miles south of Ruidoso, NM and is burning in heavy timber. Subdivisions on the south side of town were evacuated as a precaution and Highway 70 was closed. Spotting up to one mile ahead of the fire was observed.

HOMESTEAD, New Mexico State Capitan District. A Type 2 Incident Management team (Kvale) is assigned. Crews made significant progress in mopup and lining spot fires. Steep, rugged terrain is making mopup difficult.

HIDDEN COMPLEX, Lincoln National Forest. These lightning caused fires are 30 miles southwest of Carlsbad, NM. This complex includes the Hidden, Devils Den and Wilderness fires. The fires have been turned back to the district.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

BIG, Shasta-Trinity National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management team (Szczepanik) is assigned. This fire is located on Manzanita Ridge above the Big Flat campground. Steep terrain is making containment efforts difficult.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

DIXIE/LAFAYETTE COMPLEX, Florida Division of Forestry. A State Type 2 Incident Management Team (Koehler) is assigned.

GATOR SLOUGH, Florida Division of Forestry. This lightning caused fire is burning in a swamp and is completely inaccessible. The fire received some precipitation.

CRAVEN ISLAND, Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. A Fire Use Management Team (Cook) is assigned. This fire is near Minnies Island, GA. Fire movement has been minimal due to rainfall received during the last three days. Assessment of long term potential of the fire continues.

LEMONS GAP COMPLEX, Texas State Forest Service. This fire is burning in grass, pinyon pine and juniper 32 miles east of Marathon, TX. This complex is comprised of the Lemons Gap, Right Hand Canyon and Pine Peak fires. Hand crews are working to remove fuels around homes. Steep terrain, winds and low relative humidity continue to hamper suppression efforts.

SMOKE CREEK, Northwestern Land Office, Montana Department of Natural Resources and Conservation. This wind driven lightning caused fire is in the vicinity of the Fisher River and Smoke Creek. The fire has made short runs with flame lengths of 20 to 25 feet. Lower temperatures and higher humidity helped with containment efforts.

OUTLOOK:

An upper level trough pushing into Arizona and New Mexico will bring strong gusty winds to portions of the area. High temperatures will be in the 70's in the mountains, to near 105 in the deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range from 5 to 15 percent. Winds will be southwest to west at 15 to 30 mph.

A weak cold front is located over southern Georgia while high pressure covers Florida bringing partly cloudy skies with scattered thundershowers mainly in southern Florida. High temperatures will be in the 80's to low 90's. Minimum relative humidity will be above 40 percent. Winds will be southwest to west at 5 to 15 mph.

High pressure is building over northern California bringing mostly sunny skies with low clouds along the coast. High temperatures will be in the 60's along the coast to the 80's inland. Minimum relative humidity will be 10 to 25 percent inland. Winds will be northwest to northeast at 5 to 15 mph except for gusts up to 25 mph in the northern Sacramento Valley.

A cold front is moving across Colorado bringing partly cloudy skies with scattered thundershowers mainly along and east of the divide. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's except for the lower western valleys which will be in the 80's and 90's. Minimum relative humidity will range from 15 to 30 percent. Winds will be southwest to northwest at 5 to 15 mph.
