

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 SATURDAY, JUNE 9, 2001 - 0900 MDT
 NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Four new large fires were reported, one each in Arizona, New Mexico, Florida, and Utah. Two large fires were contained in Florida. Initial attack activity increased in the Southwest and Great Basin Areas as dry lightning moved through the Four Corners states. Fire activity was light throughout the rest of the United States. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, Arizona, New Mexico, Texas, Utah, Nevada, and Colorado.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

T-17, Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge. This fire was started by lightning in Brevard County on 6/7. A burnout operation has been successfully completed.

CRAVEN ISLAND, Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. This fire is near Minnies Island, GA. The fire remains active, but no significant acreage gain has been noted.

REFLECTION, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 13 miles southeast of the Orlando airport. No new information was reported.

FOUR MILE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire was started by lightning 20 miles west of Miami, FL in Broward County. Smoke from the fire is causing visibility problems for motorists. The fire remains in monitor status.

SQUAWK CREEK 2, Everglades National Park. The fire is four miles west of the Pa-Hey-Okee overlook in the Squawk Creek area. This fire and a smaller fire nearby are being managed to accomplish resource objectives. No new information was reported.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

VALENCY, Las Cruces Field Office, BLM. This fire started in Sonora, Mexico along Highway 2 and spread onto private ranch land in the United States. The fire is moving toward the northeast. Light rain was received on the fire yesterday. The Mexican portion of the fire has been contained through coordination with SEMARNAP (Mexico Forestry). A confinement strategy is being employed on the United States side of the border.

CALVA, San Carlos Agency, BIA. This fire is burning along Highway 70 near the San Carlos Reservoir. Intense burning has been observed in continuous salt cedar thickets.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

TIMPIE, Salt Lake Field Office, BLM. This fire is 40 miles west of Salt Lake City. The fire is making aggressive runs in light fuels. The Skull Valley Highway was temporarily closed due to smoke. Steep, rocky terrain is hindering containment efforts.

OUTLOOK:

*** A FIRE WEATHER WATCH IS POSTED IN SOUTHEAST IDAHO FOR STRONG WINDS ***

Strong winds will precede a cold front which will be moving through eastern Idaho tonight. Temperatures will be in the 70's in the mountains and in the 80's to 90's at lower elevations. Relative humidity will range from 15 to 30 percent. Winds will be from the southwest at 10 to 25 mph with gusts to 30 mph.

A stationary cold front over Georgia and high pressure over Florida will bring mostly cloudy skies with scattered thundershowers to the area. High temperatures will be in the high 80's to low 90's. Minimum relative humidity will be 50 percent or higher. Winds will be west at 5 to 15 mph.

A hot, dry airmass will remain over the Southwest Area except some moisture will be present in eastern New Mexico. Mostly sunny conditions will dominate the area with isolated thunderstorms in New Mexico and southeast Arizona. High temperatures will be in the 70's to 80's in the

mountains and 105 to 112 in the deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range from 5 to 15 percent throughout the area except 20 to 35 percent in eastern New Mexico. Winds will be southwest to west at 10 to 20 mph.
