

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, JUNE 10, 2001 - 0900 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Five new large fires were reported in Florida, two of which reached containment. Two new large fires were reported in Utah, one of which reached containment. One large fire in New Mexico reached containment. Initial attack activity was moderate in northern California, Arizona, New Mexico, Colorado, Utah, and Florida, and light elsewhere. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, Colorado, Nevada, New Mexico, and Utah.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

T-17, Merritt Island National Wildlife Refuge. This fire was started by lightning in Brevard County. The fire is in the process of mopup.

BLACK JACK LAKE, Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. This fire was started by lightning on 6/8. Inaccessibility is hampering containment efforts.

CRAVEN ISLAND, Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. This fire is near Minnies Island, GA. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

MAXY, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire was started by lightning in Osceola County, FL. No other information was received.

CATTAIL, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire was started by lightning in Dade County, FL. The northwest flank of the fire has converged with a natural fuel break. Crews continue to work the south flank of the fire.

REFLECTION, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 13 miles southeast of the Orlando airport. Air resources are being utilized on this fire.

FOUR MILE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire was started by lightning 20 miles west of Miami, FL in Broward County. Florida Highway Patrol evaluated highway visibility for motorists. The fire remains active on the western side and personnel continue to monitor status.

SQUAWK CREEK 2, Everglades National Park. The fire is four miles west of the Pa-Hey-Okee overlook in the Squawk Creek area. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

VALENCY, Las Cruces Field Office, BLM. This fire started in Sonora, Mexico along Highway 2 and is approximately 35 miles east of Douglas, AZ. The fire continues to spread onto private ranch land in the United States. Cloud cover and cooler night temperatures assisted with containment efforts.

EASTERN GREAT BASIN LARGE FIRES:

TIMPIE, Salt Lake Field Office, BLM. This fire is 40 miles west of Salt Lake City. The fire is making aggressive runs in light fuels. The Skull Valley Highway was temporarily closed due to smoke. Hand crews are making good progress at higher elevations.

8 MILE, Salt Lake Field Office, BLM. This fire is 20 miles west of Grantsville. Resources assigned made significant progress although erratic fire behavior was observed.

An upper level trough moving into the Northwest region will bring increasing winds over the Great Basin and Rocky Mountains. Nevada, Utah, and western Colorado can expect mostly sunny skies with a few thunderstorms. High temperatures will be in the high 80's and 90's over much of the area except for near 100 degrees in southern Utah. Minimum relative humidity will range from 5 to 15 percent. Winds will be from the southwest at 15 to 30 mph with gusts to 40 mph in portions of Utah.

The upper level trough moving into the Northwest region will bring increasing winds over Arizona and New Mexico. Partly cloudy skies are expected for the area with a few thunderstorms in central and eastern New Mexico. High temperatures will be in the high 80's in the mountains and 105 to 110 in the deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range from 5 to 15 percent throughout the area except 20 to 30 percent in eastern New Mexico. Winds will be southwest to west at 10 to 20 mph with gusts to 30 mph in northern Arizona.

High pressure with a moist airmass continues over Florida, bringing mostly cloudy skies with scattered thundershowers to the area. High temperatures will be in the high 80's to low 90's. Minimum relative humidity will be above 50 percent and winds will be southwest to west at 5 to 15 mph.
