

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
 FRIDAY, MARCH 16, 2001 - 1000 MST
 NATIONAL PREPARDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fire activity was reported in the Eastern and Southern Areas. All large fires were contained in the Eastern Area and nine large fires reached containment in the Southern Area. Moderate initial attack activity continues in the Southern Area with the Eastern Area being light. Most of the Southeast will have cloudy skies with rain showers expected from Tennessee over to North Carolina. Scattered showers and thunderstorms expected for central Florida as well.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

JOE JR., Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is near Lakeport, FL. Crews continue with mop up.

GERTIE BROWN, St. Marks National Wildlife Refuge. The fire is near Sopchoppy, FL. Mop up continues and fire activity is low.

SOPCHOPPY, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is near Sopchoppy, FL. No new information received.

DALLUS CREEK, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is near Perry, FL. Crews continue with mop up.

RED BEACH, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Highlands County, FL. Mop up is continuing.

MULTI COMMAND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Dade County, FL. Crews are continuing with mop up.

SUMMERSET COMMAND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Martin County, FL. No new information received.

OUTLOOK:

The Southeast can expect a chance of showers from Tennessee to North Carolina today, with only partly cloudy skies south. A cold front moving through Central Florida will produce scattered showers and thunderstorms from Daytona Beach to Miami. Arkansas, Louisiana and Alabama will have high temperatures in the mid 50's to mid 60's, eastward the high temperatures will reach the upper 60's to 70's, while Southern Florida will see high temperatures in the 80's.

Low pressure continues to sit off the Northwestern coastline producing rain showers over Washington and western Oregon. A trough that moved inland yesterday will develop low pressure over the Four Corners region, producing rain showers from southwestern Utah to Denver and snowfall over Aspen and Salt Lake City. The desert Southwest will have cloudy skies. High temperatures will reach the 40's across eastern Washington and Montana down through Nevada, Utah and Colorado. The coast will reach high temperatures in the 50's, with California, Arizona and New Mexico in the low 50's to low 60's.

Low pressure in the east will continue to push precipitation across the upper Midwest today. High pressure moving towards South Dakota will help clear skies over the Plains States. Kansas, Southern Missouri and most of the Ohio River Valley will have high temperatures in the mid 40's to low 50's. Oklahoma and northern Texas will have high temperatures in the 50's, while central and southern Texas will have high temperatures in the 60's and 70's.

A low pressure system over Maryland will produce rain over the Virginia's northward as it moves out over the Atlantic later in the day. The extreme

Northeast will be variably cloudy and remain dry. High temperatures will be in the 30's along the Canadian border, 40's from Pennsylvania to central Maine and low 50's to low 60's in the Virginia s, Washington D.C. and Delaware.
