

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, MARCH 23, 2001 - 1000 MST
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

Three new large fires were reported in the Southern Area and six large fires were contained. Initial attack activity decreased in the Southern Area due to precipitation during the past week. Eastern Area is starting to report an increase in fire activity.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

JOE JR., Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is near Lakeport, FL. Crews continue with mop up. No additional information received.

RED BEACH, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Highlands County, FL. Mop up is continuing.

MULTI COMMAND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Dade County, FL. Crews continue to mop up and monitor firelines. No additional information received.

SUMMERSET COMMAND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Martin County, FL. Crews continue to mop up and monitor firelines. No additional information received.

OUTLOOK:

High pressure near Tallahassee, Florida continues to dominate, producing light winds and a few high clouds. Tennessee and northern Arkansas will see an increasing chance of showers late today as a cold front moves southward. Regional high temperatures will range in the low 60's to mid

70's, with southern Florida approaching the 80's.

Unstable air over the central states will produce a chance of showers across northeastern Nevada, Utah and western Colorado. Much of the West will remain warm and mild with the eastern portions of Montana and Wyoming a little cooler and cloudy due to a passing cold front. Montana, Wyoming and Colorado will have high temperatures in the mid 40's to mid 50's, with upper 50's and upper 60's over Washington, Oregon, Nevada and over the Four Corners area. California will be in the 60's along the coast, 50's in the Sierras and in the low 70's to low 80's in the valleys. Most of Arizona and New Mexico will have high temperatures in the 70's to low 80's.

A cold front stretching from Lake Erie to Kansas and Oklahoma will bring cooler air southward today. Most of the region will see sunny skies with a few clouds. There will be a chance of showers later in the day over Kansas, Oklahoma and Missouri. High temperatures will be in the 20's across North Dakota and northern Minnesota. South Dakota, most of Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin and Michigan will be in the 30's to 40's. From Nebraska south to Kansas high temperatures will be in the 50's. Kansas, Oklahoma and north Texas will be in the 60's and 70's, with southern portions of Texas reaching in the low 80's.

The precipitation over the Northeast will change to snow as the storm moves northward. The chance of snow will gradually decrease throughout the day. High temperatures will reach into the 30's and lower 40's in the northern part of the region, the mid 40's to mid 50's over Connecticut south into West Virginia. Virginia and Maryland will have high temperatures into the 60's.
