

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT  
WEDNESDAY, MAY 30, 2001 - 0530 MDT  
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

New large fires were reported in Florida, and one large fire was contained in Oregon. High pressure over the West will bring sunny, hot and dry weather. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Arizona, California, Idaho, New Mexico, Texas and Utah.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

SILVER EAGLE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is burning in a large dry lakebed and swamp area near Groveland, FL. A helicopter assisted with containment efforts.

DIXIE/LAFAYETTE COMPLEX, Florida Division of Forestry. This complex, which includes the Mallory Swamp fire, is approximately 25 miles north of Perry, FL. A new spot fire occurred north of the main fire.

MINERAL SPRINGS, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Sarasota County, FL. Spotting is hampering containment efforts.

MARTIN GATE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 30 miles east of Sarasota, FL. The fire jumped Highway 72, closing the road for several hours.

776, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Charlotte County near Englewood, FL. Spotting is impeding containment efforts.

BOG HOLE, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is burning in a large dry swamp in Sumter County, FL. Crews continue with burnout operations to assist in containment.

CRAVEN ISLAND, Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge. A Fire Use Management Team (Cook) is assigned. This fire is near Minnies Island, GA. Structure protection is in place at the Stephen Foster State Park. Containment lines continue to be improved along the perimeter. Fire activity has moderated due to rainfall.

BLACKWATER COMMAND, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is in Hillsborough County, FL. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

APEX, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire in Levy County, FL. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

BLOUT PASTURE, Georgia State Forestry Commission. The fire is near Darian, GA. in McIntosh County. Thick peat and duff layers continue to pose problems for mopup operations. A small amount of precipitation has been received.

ARABIA BAY, Georgia State Forestry Commission. The fire is near Homerville, GA in Clinch County. Crews are monitoring containment lines. Some rain was received on the incident. The fire will go into monitoring status unless significant activity occurs.

RACE POND, Georgia State Forestry Commission. This fire is approximately 20 miles north of Waycross, GA. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is received.

RACE TRACK COMPLEX, National Forests in Mississippi. This fire is 16 miles north of Gulfport, MS. No new information was reported.

LEMONS GAP COMPLEX, Texas State Forest Service. This fire is burning in grass, pinyon pine and juniper 32 miles east of Marathon, TX. This complex is comprised of the Lemons Gap, Right Hand Canyon and Peak fires. These fires are burning in steep terrain and containment is being hampered by material rolling downhill. Structures threatened on the Lemons Gap fire have been secured.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

HIDDEN COMPLEX, Lincoln National Forest. Type 2 Incident Management Team (Garcia) is assigned. These lightning caused fires are 30 miles southwest of Carlsbad, NM. This complex includes the Hidden, Devils Den and Wilderness fires. It is burning in pinyon pine, juniper and desert shrubs. Mopup on the Hidden fire continues. Devils Den fire is very active and burning in steep terrain. Air tanker operations had to be suspended due to high winds.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA LARGE FIRES:

DEVIL, Lassen-Modoc Ranger Unit, California Department of Forestry. This fire is five miles west of Susanville, CA. Fireline construction continues. Helicopters are being utilized in containment efforts. Predicted north winds did not develop allowing for more direct action.

PILLSBURY, Mendocino National Forest. This fire is burning near Lake Pillsbury, CA. Crews continue with fireline construction.

High pressure over California will bring sunny, hot and dry weather. High temperatures will be in the 60's and 70's in the coastal areas and from the 90's to lower 100's inland. Minimum relative humidity will range from 10 to 18 percent. Winds will be north to northeast at 10 to 20 mph.

A weak cold front will push south and off of the Atlantic Coast leaving northern Florida under a dry northwest flow. Lingering moisture will produce scattered showers and thunderstorms in southern Florida. High temperatures will be near 90. Minimum relative humidity will range from 30 to 35 percent in the Panhandle, to near 45 percent in central Florida and to almost 60 percent in the south. Winds will be mostly southwest to northwest at 5 to 10 mph.

High pressure over Arizona and New Mexico will bring hot, dry weather. There will be a slight chance of thunderstorms over eastern New Mexico plains and northern New Mexico mountains. High temperatures will in the 70's in the northern mountains to near 110 in the deserts. Minimum relative humidity will range from 5 to 15 percent. Winds will be northwest at 10 to 20 mph in New Mexico and generally slope to valley at 5 to 10 mph in Arizona.

High pressure over Nevada will bring sunny, warmer and drier conditions. High temperatures will be in the mid 70's to lower 90's in most areas, the southern deserts will be in the mid 90's to mid 100's. Minimum relative humidity will range from 10 to 18 percent. Winds will be north to northeast at 5 to 15 mph.
