INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, JANUARY 18, 2002- 1000 MST
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was moderate in the Southern Area and light in Northern and Southern California, the Southwest and Rocky Mountain areas. A large fire was reported and contained this week in the Eastern and Southern Areas. Prescribed burning activity increased with projects being carried out in Northern and Southern California, Rocky Mountain, Southwest, and the Southern Areas. Very high fire indices were reported in Texas.

OUTLOOK:

Waves of low pressure moving along a stationary front will be draped across the southeast. This will produce some light rain from eastern Virginia across to southern Alabama. On Saturday the cold front will push east and south bringing showers to the south and snow to the north, while high pressure builds into Texas and Oklahoma. Scattered light rain is expected to begin spreading back into the Lower Mississippi River Valley as high pressure keeps the Appalachian mountains to the east coast dry.

An area of low pressure is forecast to move eastward through the southern tier states of the Eastern Area Friday into Saturday producing fairly significant snowfall amounts across mainly the southern portions of Missouri, Illinois, Indiana and Ohio. The low will then move northeast through the mid-Atlantic states and up the Atlantic seaboard Saturday into Sunday creating additional areas of significant snow over much of the eastern mid-Atlantic and New England states. Some of the precipitation may fall as a mixture of snow, freezing rain and sleet at times, especially over Maryland and eastern Virginia. Another weaker area of low pressure will advance through the Great Lakes region on Sunday into Monday producing areas of light snow over this area. Temperatures early next week are expected climb to above normal levels across much of the area.

Hights will range from the 30s through the middle Mississippi Valley with 80s possible in south Texas. Humidity will be 35 to 45 percent across Kentucky, Virginia, and western North Carolina, with above 50 percent elsewhere on Friday. Winds will be 5 to 10 mph from southeast Texas across northern Alabama except 5 to 10 mph across southern Alabama and most of Florida.
