

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY JUNE 6, 2004 – 0800 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 1

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was heavy in Colorado and light elsewhere, with 98 fires reported nationally. One new large fire was reported in the Southern California Area. One large fire was contained in the Rocky Mountain Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Kansas, Nevada, New Mexico, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas, Utah and Wyoming.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AREA LARGE FIRES:

GAVIOTA, Santa Barbara County Fire Department. A California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection Type 1 Incident Command Team (Henson) is assigned. This fire is 15 miles west of Santa Barbara, CA in chaparral and grass. Wind driven fire behavior has caused U.S. Highway 101 to be closed, and residences in Holister Ranch have been evacuated. Union Pacific railroad trestles have burned. The Tip-Top Ranch, an oil processing plant and 150 residences are threatened.

SOUTHWEST AREA LARGE FIRES:

PEPPIN, Lincoln National Forest. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Bateman) is assigned. This fire is six miles northeast of Capitan, NM in timber. Steep terrain, poor accessibility, heavy fuel loading, prolonged drought and high winds continue to be major concerns. Interior torching and short runs were observed. Crews conducted burn out operations.

KP, Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest. This fire is 20 miles south of Alpine, AZ in brush and mixed conifer. Creeping was observed in unburned islands in the interior. Crews continued to improve fireline. No further information was received.

SOUTHERN AREA LARGE FIRES:

SANTA FE SWAMP, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is six miles southwest of Keystone Heights, FL in dry swamp. No new information was reported.

ROAD 1, Florida Division of Forestry. A Florida Division of Forestry Type 2 Incident Management Team (Jones) is assigned. This fire is 17 miles northwest of Macclenny, FL in pine. No new information was reported.

YELVINGTON, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is five miles east of East Palatka, FL in swamp. No new information was reported.

ROCK ROAD, Florida Division of Forestry. This fire is 11 miles southeast of Bonita Springs, FL in pine, cabbage palm and cypress. No new information was reported.

WESTERN GREAT BASIN AREA LARGE FIRES:

MAIL SUMMIT, Ely Field Office, Bureau of Land Management. This fire is 41 miles west of Panaca, NV in grass, sage and pinyon-juniper. A confinement strategy is in place. Steep terrain, extremely dry fuels and low relative humidity continue to be major concerns. Short runs and interior torching were observed. Reduction in acreage is due to more accurate mapping.

OUTLOOK:

Weather Discussion: A broad low pressure system will continue to push inland today over the Northwest and Northern Rockies. The low will bring showers to the coasts of Oregon and Washington as well as northern Idaho. Further east, over the plains of Montana, thunderstorms are possible with gusty winds. Winds will also be strong across the northern Great Basin as temperatures begin to fall. In the Southwest, hot, dry and breezy conditions will be the rule. Some thunderstorms are also possible in southern Colorado and northern New Mexico in the afternoon. Central Florida will once again experience scattered thunderstorms today.
