

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
SUNDAY, JUNE 4, 2006 0800 MDT
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was light nationally with 60 new fires reported. Three new large fires (*) were reported, two in the Southwest Area and one in the Southern California Area. One large fire was contained in the Southern California Area. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Mexico, Utah, Nevada, Oklahoma, and Texas.

SOUTHWEST AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

LA BARRANCA, Tucson office, Arizona State. A Type 2 Incident Management Team (Reinarz) is assigned. This fire is six miles east of Sedona, AZ in brush and pinyon pine. Minimal fire activity was reported.

BOOT, Las Vegas District, New Mexico State Forestry. This fire is 15 miles north of Santa Rosa, NM in grass. No further information was received.

MESA, Las Vegas District, New Mexico State Forestry. This fire is 10 miles north of Santa Rosa, NM in grass. No further information was received.

TAYLOR, Gila National Forest. This previously reported lightning-caused Wildland Fire Use (WFU) incident is being managed to accomplish resource objectives. The fire is burning 25 miles west of Winston, NM in pinyon pine. No further information was received. This will be the last narrative report unless significant activity occurs.

MORA RANCH, Las Vegas District, New Mexico State Forestry. This fire is seven miles northwest of Wagon Mound, NM in grass and pinyon pine. No new information was reported. This will be the last report unless new information is reported.

WILLOW CREEK, Southeast Area, Utah State Division of Forestry Fire & State Lands. A transfer of command from a Type 2 Incident Management Team (Lund) back to the local unit will occur tomorrow. This fire is 55 miles north of Moab, UT in brush, juniper and timber. Isolated torching was observed.

OUTLOOK:

Weather Discussion: High pressure will remain over much of the West today with much above normal temperatures. Isolated dry thunderstorms are possible for southeastern Arizona and portions of New Mexico. Winds will increase across portions of the Great Basin and Northern Rockies with the approach of the next weather disturbance into the Pacific Northwest. In Alaska, drier conditions are expected as a storm system departs to the east.
