

INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SITUATION REPORT
FRIDAY, MARCH 3, 2006 – 0800 MST
NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS LEVEL 2

CURRENT SITUATION:

Initial attack activity was heavy nationally this week with 1,503 new fires reported. Fifty-one new large fires were reported, 41 in the Southern Area, four in the Rocky Mountain Area, three in the Eastern Area, two in the Southwest Area, and one in the Northern California Area. Twenty-six large fires were contained, 20 in the Southern Area, three in the Rocky Mountain Area, and one each in the Eastern, Northern California and Southwest Areas. Very high to extreme fire indices were reported in California, New Mexico, Arizona, Colorado, Texas, Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska, South Dakota, Wyoming and Illinois.

SOUTHERN AREA INCIDENTS/LARGE FIRES:

OKLAHOMA FIRE RESPONSE, Oklahoma State. An Oklahoma State Type 2 Incident Management Team (Couch) is assigned in Shawnee, OK. The Team is assisting local, state, and federal jurisdictions with managing existing fires and initial attack in Oklahoma. Acres, structure losses and costs have been adjusted to represent cumulative ABC Miscellaneous fire activity statewide since January 1.

NORTH CENTRAL TEXAS IA, Texas Forest Service. A Texas State Type 2 Incident Management Team (Hannemann) is in place in Granbury, TX. The Team is assisting local jurisdictions with managing existing fires and initial attack within the 220,000 square mile West Zone fire management response area. Large fires within the management area include the Ransom and Arkansas Road. Acres, structure losses and costs have been adjusted to represent cumulative fire activity from December 1, 2005 to present for the response area.

KING RANCH, Texas Forest Service. This fire is 13 miles northwest of Jacksboro, TX in grass. Structures are threatened. The Incident Commander requested the evacuation of 15 homes. Active fire behavior with spotting was reported. The fire is being managed under North Central Texas IA.

SADDLE MOUNTAIN, North Carolina State Division of Forestry. This fire is 12 miles northwest of Dobson, NC in slash and hardwood litter. Structures are threatened. A Type 2 Incident Management Team has been ordered.

LOCO, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is near the town of Loco, OK in grass. Five structures were destroyed. No further information was received.

CHANDLER, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is near the town of Chandler, OK in grass. No further information was received.

FREEDOM HILL, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is eight miles south of Mannford, OK in timber and grass. Three structures were lost. Extreme fire behavior was reported.

MOTEN MOUNTAIN, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is 11 miles southeast of Stilwell, OK in timber. Watershed and wildlife habitat are threatened. Extreme fire behavior was reported.

OUTPOST, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is two miles northwest of Kenwood, OK in timber. One structure was destroyed. Active fire behavior with torching and spotting was reported.

NAIL RANCH, Texas Forest Service. This fire is 10 miles northwest of Albany, TX in grass. No further information was received.

EMPIRE, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is five miles north of Empire, OK in grass. Twenty structures were destroyed. No further information was received.

CALERA RAILROAD, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is two miles southwest of Calera, OK in timber. The fire is being patrolled. No further information was received.

CAT HOLLOW, Daniel Boone National Forest. This fire is ten miles southwest of Hyden, KY in timber. Two structures were destroyed. Backing and flanking fire with two foot flame lengths was observed.

BAGWELL, Texas Forest Service. This fire is west of Clarksville, TX in timber. Rough terrain, gusty winds and low relative humidity are hampering containment efforts. A ranch is threatened. No further information was received.

LOWER ELK, Kentucky Division of Forestry. This fire is four miles south of Woodman, KY in timber. No further information was received.

WELEETKA, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is one mile south of Weleetka, OK in grass and understory. No further information was received.

MARLOW, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is near Durant, OK in grass. No further information was received.

SPIRO NORTH, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is two miles north of Spiro, OK in timber and grass. No further information was received.

HULAH LAKE, Osage Agency. This fire is five miles northwest of Bartlesville, OK in grass and timber. Extreme fire behavior with a rapid rate of spread along with torching and spotting was reported.

WOODWARD, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is five miles north of Woodward, OK in grass. No further information was received.

PERRY, Oklahoma Division of Forestry. This fire is five miles east of Perry, OK in grass. The fire is being patrolled. No further information was received.

DEER HIDE, Daniel Boone National Forest. This fire is 15 miles southwest of Corbin, KY in hardwood litter. Ten residences and several gas wells are threatened. Uphill runs were reported.

Weather Discussion: Dry and windy conditions will extend from southeastern California, across much of the Four-Corner states, and into western Kansas today associated with a developing low pressure system. Windy conditions will also develop over the Dakotas extending into the central Plains. Another windy day is on tap for Saturday for much of the northern and central Plains, and wind with dry conditions for the eastern Four-Corner region extending into the southern Plains. Winds will weaken on Sunday.
